Dr. Hugh Foley examines the imagery of the American Indian in Oklahoma from the public school, commercial and authentic tribal points of view. The presentation displays images taken from around Oklahoma since 1998 and illustrates how any image of an American Indian can be contextualized in one of these three ways. While the American Indian mascot issue is a focal point of this discussion, additional imagery from commercial and tribal perspectives, as well as in national American popular culture, also are included in this 30-minute presentation that provides time for lively questions and discussions.
