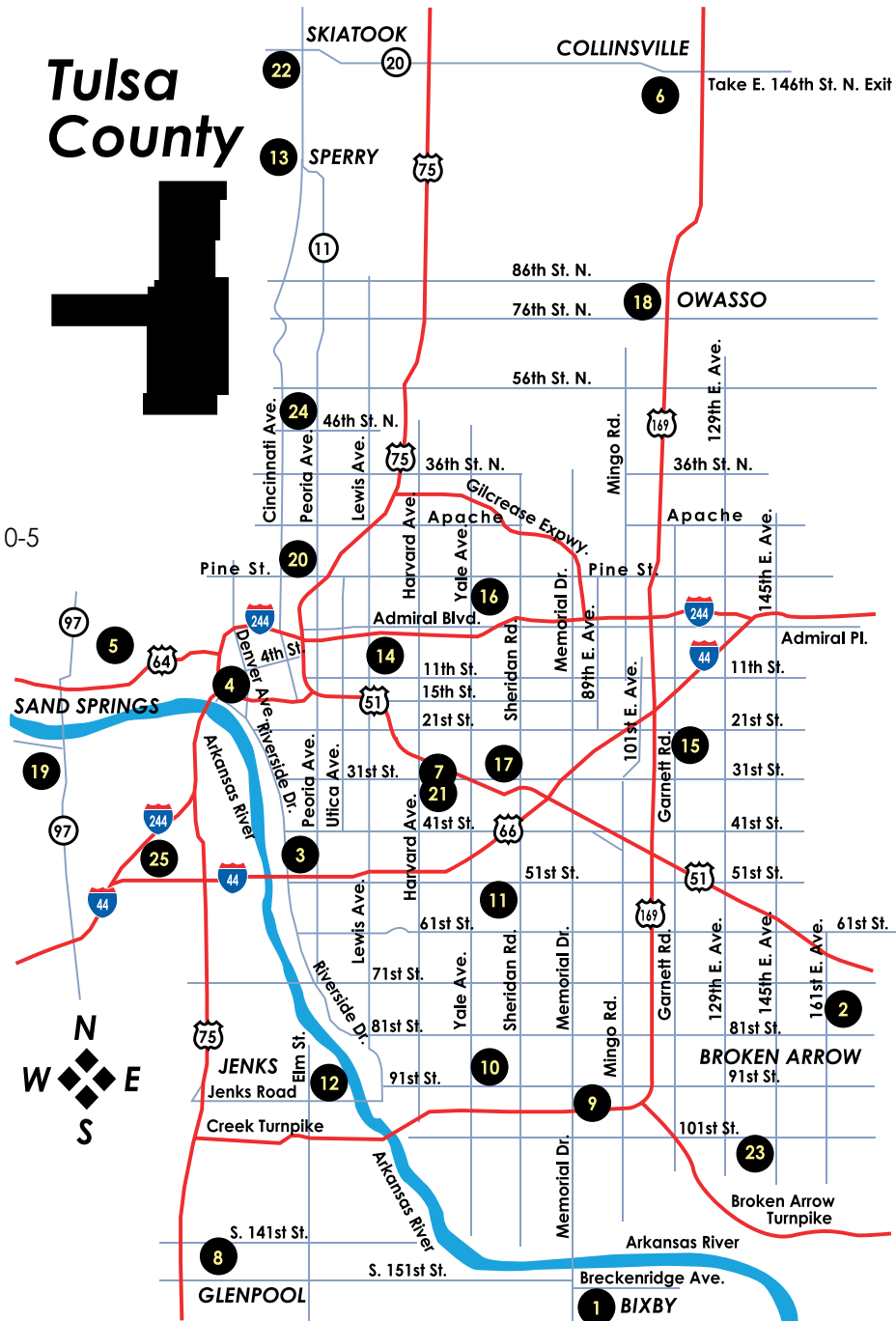

Your child heard stories from some of these books today.

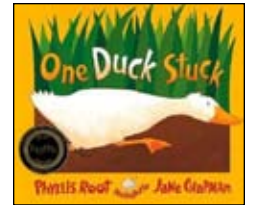

When Mom or Dad asks what you did today, you can tell them the Reading Roadshow came to read and play!

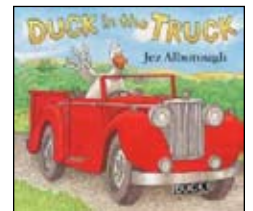
**"One Duck Stuck" by Phyllis Root**

In this counting book, increasingly larger groups of animals try to help a duck that is stuck in the sleepy, slimy marsh.



**"Duck in the Truck" by Jez Alborough**

Duck's truck is stuck in the muck. Who will help him out? First, frog lends a hand. Then sheep helps push, too. But duck's truck won't come unstuck! Can anyone help him get out of the muck? Or is duck out of luck?



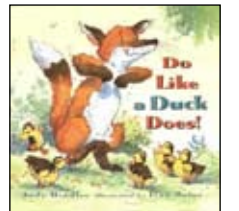
**"Duck on a Bike" by David Shannon**

A duck decides to ride a bike and soon influences all the other animals on the farm to ride bikes too.



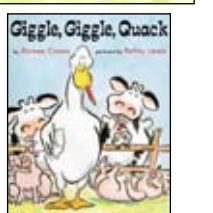
**"Do Like a Duck Does" by Judy Hindley**

By challenging a hairy stranger to imitate the behavior of herself and her ducklings, a mother duck proves that he is a fox and not a duck.



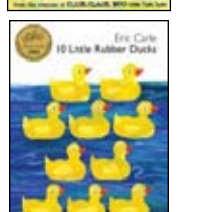
**"Giggle Giggle Quack" by Doreen Cronin**

When a storm strikes a cargo ship, 10 rubber ducks are tossed overboard and swept off in 10 different directions.



## Reading With Your Child

As you read with your child, from time to time point out the different parts of the book, like this: "Here's our next book ... here's the *title* right on the *front cover* ... I'm going to open it this way, and turn the first *page*." When your child is older, you can make "mistakes," such as opening the book upside down or turning to the last page first, and let them catch you and correct you!

And when I go down to the lake,

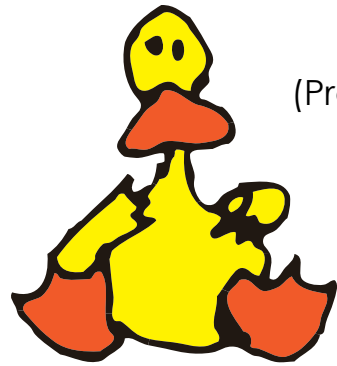
I wiggle and I wobble and I shake, shake, shake.

(Wobble and shake around like a duck.)



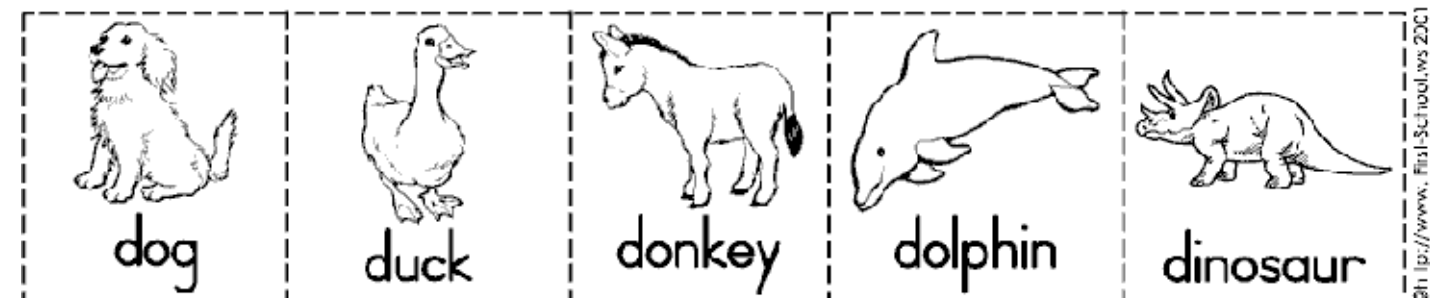
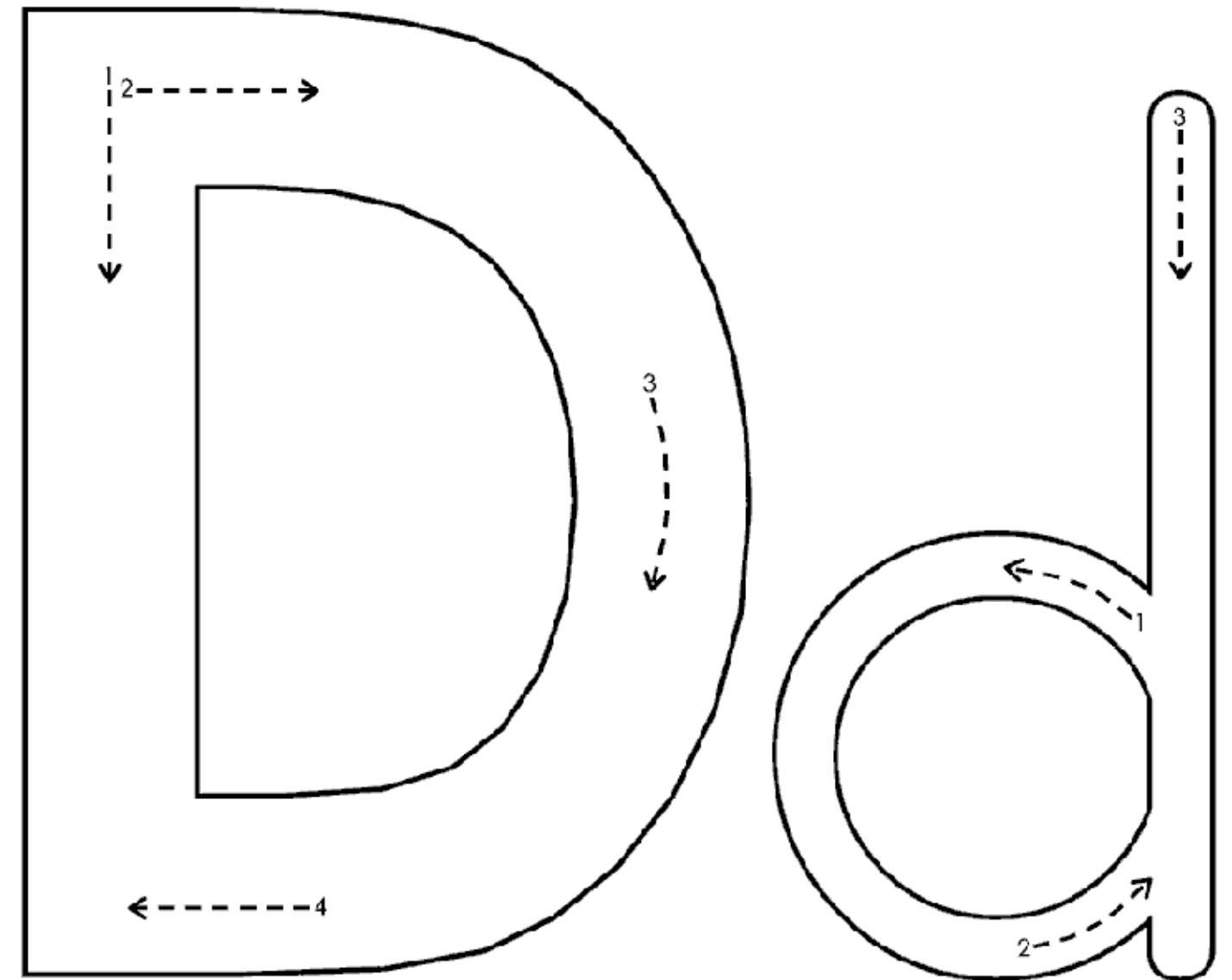
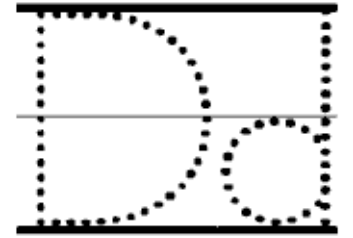
