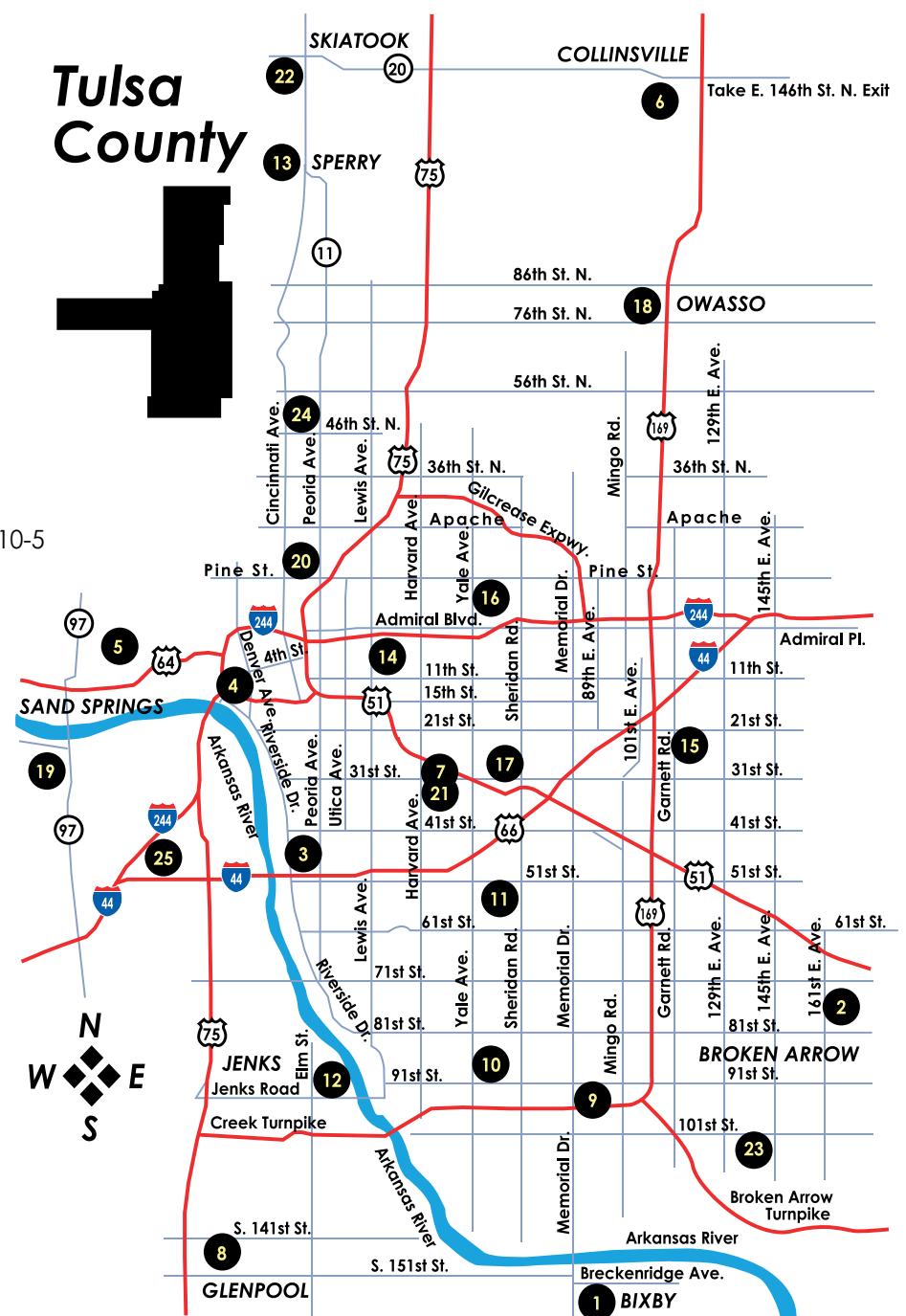

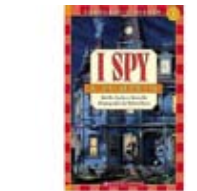

**"Good Night Monster!" by Ian Whybrow**  
Getting toddlers off to bed each night is made easier and more fun with this appealing, interactive book. It combines finding "little monsters" (actually mischievous boys and girls) hidden under large die-cut flaps and then counting them.



**"I Spy a Pumpkin" riddles by Jean Marzollo**  
New, easy-to-read riddles are paired with fun, gently spooky photographs culled from previously published "I Spy" books to create the ninth "I Spy" reader. With rhythm, rhyme and picture clues, this book is written to support the newest reader.



**"Pumpkin Eye" by Denise Fleming**  
It's Halloween night! The rising moon lights the way for trick-or-treaters and sets the mood for a spooky celebration where imagination rules. Award-winning author/artist Denise Fleming turns her talents to every child's favorite holiday.



**"Jitterbug Jam" by Barbara Jean Hicks**  
Grandpa Boo-Dad not only believes that Bobo has seen a pink-skinned boy with orange fur on his head hiding under the bed, he knows exactly how a little monster can scare off such a horrible creature.



**"Boo to a Goose" by Mem Fox**  
Would you feed your pajamas to giant piranhas or walk on your knees past a hive full of bees but never say "Boo!" to a goose? In order to avoid frightening the aforementioned fowl, author Mem Fox has concocted a boisterous baker's dozen of satisfyingly silly alternatives.



**"Go Away, Big Green Monster!" by Ed Emberley**  
Caldecott medalist Ed Emberley has designed an ingenious book to help children overcome their fear of monsters. With each turn of the page, a new part is revealed, until all of a big, green monster has taken shape. Then, with the words, "You don't scare me!," page by page, the monster slowly disappears.



## Reading With Your Child

Give your child a chance to choose his own books for reading. If your toddler chooses a book that is too long to hold his attention, read some and skip some, discussing the pictures and how they relate to the story.
