Scholarship Tips

Here are some suggestions to help keep your scholarship search on track.

1. **FAFSA**- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) each year you need aid. There are many resources available and you may not even realize that you qualify for federal aid such as work-study, scholarships, and grants.
2. **Prepare**-Gather up important documents such as standardized test scores, recommendation letters, and report cards. You may need them to complete scholarship applications. Get organized, and keep documents close at hand.
3. **Research**-Make an appointment with your school counselor and find out what scholarship opportunities may be open to you. Visit the library to pick up resources about scholarships and financial aid, and use the internet to conduct scholarship searches.
4. **Essay**-Remember that many scholarships do require an essay, so use this opportunity to be creative. Ask a teacher or your counselor to review your final draft and give feedback. The library has excellent resources available to give writing and grammar tips as well.
5. **Deadlines**-Keep track of when applications are due and apply early if possible. Apply for as many scholarships as you can, and keep track of all the requirements. Remember, documents such as letters of recommendation and transcripts are also due by the deadline, so plan ahead.

- Oklahoma resident
- Admitted to OU at the time of selection
- Attending OU as a first-time freshman in the fall of 2011 as a full-time student
- Graduating high school senior
- Apply by February 13, 2011
