A valued, trusted community center for all

Silvia Marquez says her heart palpitates every time she visits the Martin Regional Library as she gets so excited to see what new things she will discover.

“We find something new every time we go,” said this mother of three, whose family has lived in the surrounding neighborhood for 11 years. “My children grew up in the library. I used to take them in strollers to storytime when they were young and then when they got older they went to all the summer programs too. My children love to go to the library – every time is a joy for them!”

The Marquez family uses the library for all their educational, informational and recreational needs. “We live close by, and we can go to the library for free! Everything is free at the library! All the people who work there are very friendly. I know most of the people there and they know me. I feel like it is my second home. I feel like it is a family.”

Located in East Tulsa at 26th and Garnett, the Martin Regional Library serves one of the most ethnically diverse areas in Tulsa County, with a higher percentage of African-

Americans, Asians and Hispanic/Latinx populations than Tulsa County as a whole.

“We are a unifying force in our community. We are a valued and trusted center for community, information and learning for all,” said branch manager Rebecca Howard.

The Martin Regional Library is home to the Hispanic Resource Center. Established in 1999, the purpose of the Hispanic Resource Center is to provide Spanish language resources, programming and services, and to celebrate Hispanic culture. The center provides access to more than 8,000 Spanish language books, media, magazines and newspapers for all ages. To better serve this growing segment of the community, the Martin library employs 10 bilingual staff members who are very knowledgeable about the library and community services of interest to Spanish-speaking customers.

“There is no better customer service than being able to speak to someone in the language with which they are most comfortable. For as many as 30 to 40 percent of our customers, that language is Spanish,” said Howard. “Our dedicated bilingual team not only makes sure our customers receive the highest level of service, they also are instrumental in conducting outreach to the community. Whether it’s at Festival Americas, events on Tulsa City-County Library’s bookmobile, health fairs, neighborhood block parties or the Back-to-School Resource Fair, their presence extends the reach of TCCL’s services, programs and collections to all of Tulsa County’s Spanish-speaking residents.”

In addition to serving the needs of the Hispanic/Latinx community, the Martin Regional Library also hosts Tulsa City-County Library’s annual Asian-American Festival. Thousands of festivalgoers turn out each year on a designated Saturday in June to celebrate the colorful cultures of Asia and to learn about the customs and traditions of Tulsa County’s Asian-Americans with fun arts and crafts, and entertaining, educational events for the entire

family. Plus, year-round, the Martin library is home to a circulating Chinese collection consisting of more than 300 resources, including fiction and nonfiction, in the Mandarin Chinese language.

The Martin Regional Library is named after Allie Beth Martin, the first director of the Tulsa City-County Library system, who dedicated her life to the development of modern library service, focusing on the public library as a center for community education, information, culture and recreation.

The Martin Regional Library is open year-round seven days a week. Ongoing programming includes: Book-a-Librarian appointments (in English or Spanish); Build A Reader bilingual storytime for preschoolers on Tuesdays at 11 a.m.; bilingual storytime for babies and toddlers on Thursdays at 11 a.m.; book clubs for tweens and adults; plus, a bounty of other programs for children, tweens, teens and adults scattered throughout the year. All programs are free and open to the public. Check the event listings in this guide for more details.

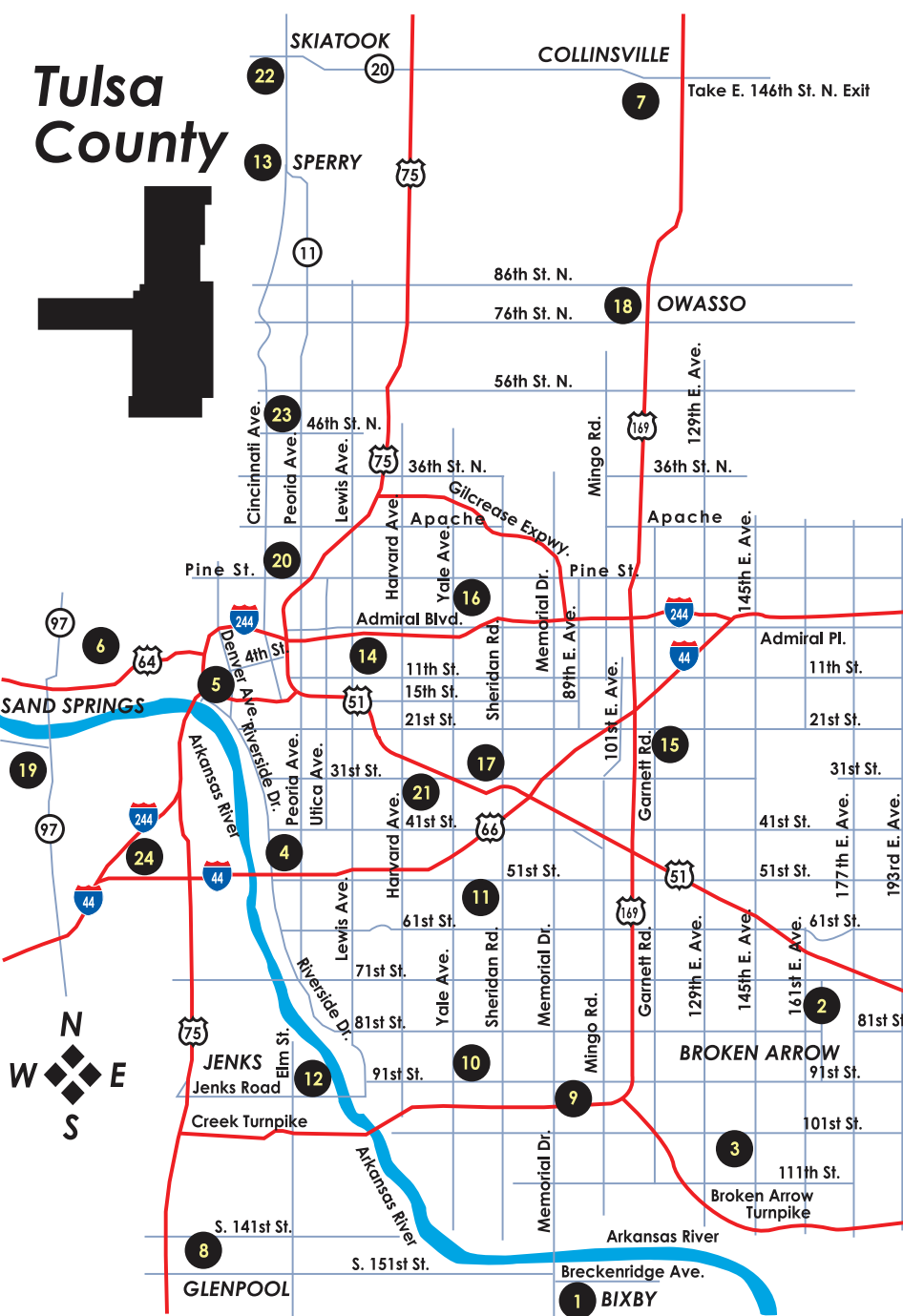
