An Emmy Award-winning documentary filmmaker, Pierre Sauvage is a child survivor of the Holocaust and a child of Holocaust survivors.

Sauvage will discuss how the world responded – or failed to respond – to the Holocaust, notably highlighted by his renowned 1989 documentary *Weapons of the Spirit*, soon to be reissued in a remastered edition. During World War II, in and around one village in Nazi-occupied France, 5,000 Jews were sheltered by 5,000 Christians. This story of that astonishing conspiracy of goodness was one Sauvage was

born to tell, as he was born and protected in Le Chambon-sur-Lignon and returned just in time to preserve the memory.

Sauvage also will focus on the American response to the crisis, showing clips from his upcoming documentaries *And Crown Thy Good: Varian Fry in Marseille* and *Not Idly By: Peter Bergson, America and Holocaust*.

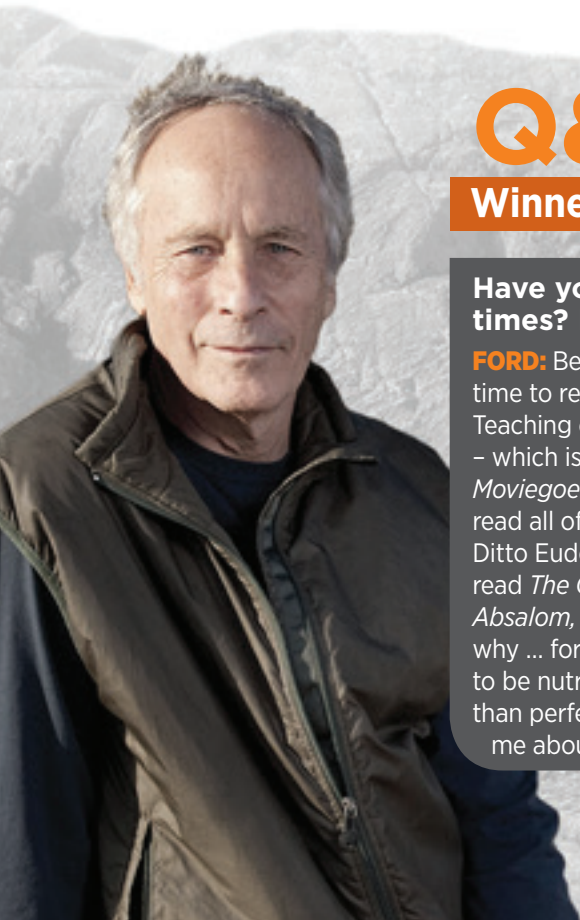

Q&A with Richard Ford

Winner of the 2017 Peggy V. Helmerich Distinguished Author Award

Have you ever read a book many times? If so, what book and why?

FORD: Because I'm a slow reader I rarely have time to revisit books, even ones I esteem. Teaching often allows me to read books again – which is one reason I teach. I've read *The Moviegoer* by Walker Percy a few times. I've read all of Chekhov's stories more than once. Ditto Eudora Welty's collected stories. I've read *The Great Gatsby* several times. I've read *Absalom, Absalom* perhaps five times. As for why ... for different reasons, I suppose. All seem to be nutritive to me, and inexhaustible (rather than perfect), and all retain the ability to teach me about the world and to affirm life.

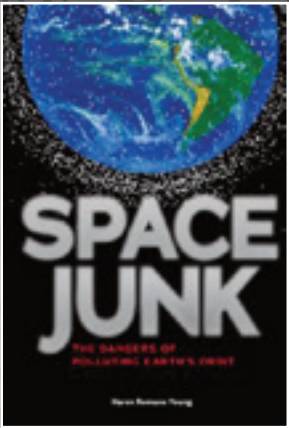
If you could be anything else in the world what would you be and why?

FORD: Let me count the things I'd still really like to do (but probably won't), for they are legion. A skeletal list: be a civil rights lawyer; be a blues harmonica virtuoso; be an archeologist; be a professional squash player; be a supertanker captain. When I was a teenager, I had a job as a fireman on the Missouri Pacific Railroad, in Arkansas. Being a fireman, at that time, was a precursor job to becoming an engineer; and many times the older engineers let me run the switch engine for half the shift, when we were working midnight to 8 shifts in the yards in Little Rock. I liked that. A lot. If I'd stayed doing that, I definitely wouldn't have written any novels. It was tempting.

Richard Ford is coming to Tulsa in December to receive the 2017 Peggy V. Helmerich Distinguished Author Award. He will answer questions from the audience at a free public presentation on Saturday, Dec. 2. See the back cover of this event guide for more details.

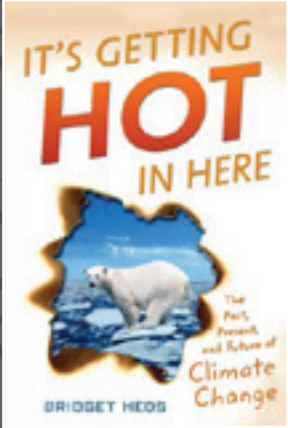
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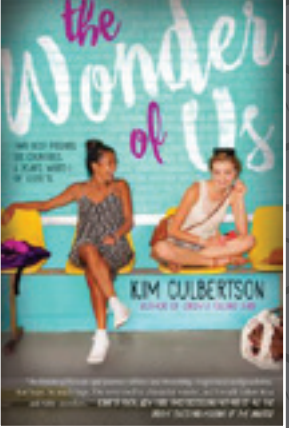

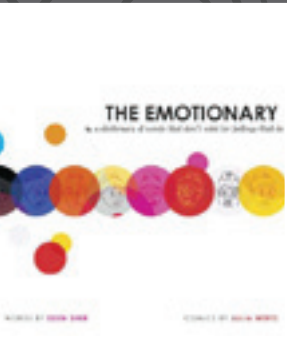

Rudisill Regional Library: A pillar for the community

FOR 41 YEARS, the Rudisill Regional Library has served as the cultural, informational and recreational hub of North Tulsa, providing the community with vast resources on nearly every subject, literacy help, computer classes and public PCs, Build A Reader storytimes, free meeting rooms, African-American history materials, plus a whole lot more.

Opened in 1976, the Rudisill Regional Library was built by the City of Tulsa as part of a multipurpose Social Services Center. In 1979, it was renamed in memory of longtime librarian Freddie Martin Rudisill. Throughout the years, the Tulsa City-County Library extensively has renovated the library, which now houses the African-American Resource Center and Jeanne B. Goodwin Storytime Room, named in honor of the late Jeanne B. Goodwin, who touched so many lives as a lifelong educator and champion of children and reading.

“The Rudisill Regional Library has been a pillar for the community for so many years,” said longtime customer Jamaal Dyer, who fondly remembers coming to the library as a child. “I grew up using the Rudisill Library and seeing the importance of reading. I am so delighted that the library is still here and that I now have the ability to bring my 3-year-old daughter, Gracelyn, to enjoy it.”

Dyer’s wife, Kimberley, also grew up using the library (Suburban Acres was her home library). “Jamaal and I both have a love of reading and for books and we really try to instill that in Gracelyn. We read to her every single night – we never miss a day! She loves reading and gets excited about checking out books from the library.”

These days, Jamaal spends a lot of time perusing Rudisill’s African-American Resource Center. As the project manager for the 1921 Tulsa Race Riot Centennial Commission, Jamaal frequently checks out the center’s 1921 Tulsa Race Riot Kit so that he continually keeps informed of it. The African-American Resource Center opened in 1998. The center collects, preserves and provides access to resources honoring and documenting the experiences of people of African descent, and current and comprehensive resource materials and professional reference materials on the culture and history of African-Americans.

To better serve the community, Tulsa City-County Library remodeled the Rudisill Regional Library in September of this year. New features include: self-checkout machines; an enlarged children’s area with more room for “Stay-n-Play” activities and child-size book bins so kids easily can find their own books; additional Wi-Fi bar with charging capability for customers using personal digital devices; and a Convenience Center for copying, scanning, faxing and wireless printing.



“We are excited about our many new improvements. The new model has opened up the library, making it more inviting and easier to use,” said longtime branch manager Keith Jemison. “To celebrate our remodeling, we are hosting an open house on Sunday, Nov. 5. We hope everyone will come out and see the library and enjoy the Friends’ holiday bazaar, which is also scheduled that same day. We will waive library fines for those who attend the open house. So, if you have any overdue items, please bring them with you and start using the library once again.”

A TRUE FRIEND

ARGLENDA FRIDAY takes friendship seriously. Whether she’s helping a friend in need or giving her time, talent and money to an organization about which she feels passionate, Friday always tries to be a true friend.

One of those organizations that has benefited from Friday’s devotion over the years is the Friends of the Rudisill Regional Library. Though she lived away from Oklahoma for many years, Friday supported the Rudisill Friends from afar as it is dear to her heart. In fact, when she returned to Tulsa a little over a year ago, one of the first things she did was to rejoin the Friends board, now serving as the group’s secretary.

“Although general membership allows one to be actively involved in all aspects of the Friends’ activities, I chose to become a board member to better serve the organization and share my experiences from working with other Friends groups in California and Florida as both a library manager and a Friends member,” said Friday, whose passion for libraries began when she was a teen working at Tulsa City-County Library’s former Seminole Hills branch under the leadership of Freddie Martin Rudisill.

For more than 40 years, the Friends of the Rudisill Regional Library has supported the library and helped raise awareness of its innumerable resources through outreach, discussion groups, lobbying and advocacy. Currently, Leslie Wade serves as the Friends’ president.

“The Rudisill Regional Library is an integral part of the North Tulsa community. Our members are truly dedicated to literacy and all of Rudisill’s initiatives,” said Friday, who is coordinating the Friends’ upcoming fundraiser for its Freddie Martin Rudisill Scholarship Award to support Tulsa City-County Library staff in continuing education.

The fundraiser – “Taste of North Tulsa Holiday and Resource Bazaar” – will take place Sunday, Nov. 5 from 1 to 4 p.m. at the Rudisill Regional Library. Admission is free. Please



bring a gently used or new children’s book to donate to the library’s literacy program.

“We want to support our neighbors and partners who often donate food, flowers and merchandise to our programs,” said Friday about additional reasons for why the Friends group is offering the bazaar. “We feel North Tulsa has a wealth of products and services to offer, so we would like to help showcase these talents and merchandise.”
