An avid reader herself, Jackson loves the convenience of having a library right in the middle of her neighborhood as she checks out many books each week, plus uses the library’s free computers since she does not have a PC at home. The new Business Center also is a big help as she utilizes it for faxing and making copies.

The Business Center was one of many exciting updates Maxwell Park Library received last March, when interior changes were made to better serve the 21st century customer. Improvements included new public PCs, full-service self-checkout machines, charging stations for digital devices, new paint and rearranged layout.

Another wonderful aspect of the Maxwell Park Library is its programming. The library offers a bounty of awesome activities for young readers and families including weekly Build A Reader

storytimes and a monthly Saturday storytime featuring great stories, silly songs and fun finger plays for children ages 8 and younger. And if you can’t attend a scheduled storytime, you can request a pop-up one on the spot every Thursday!
