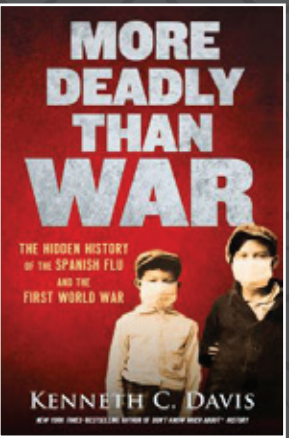
**Immortal Reign**
