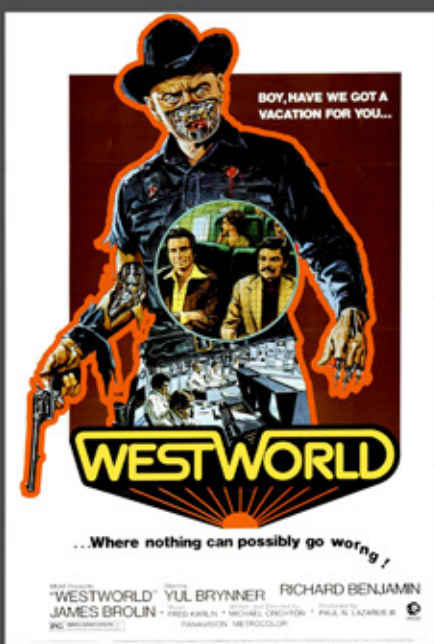

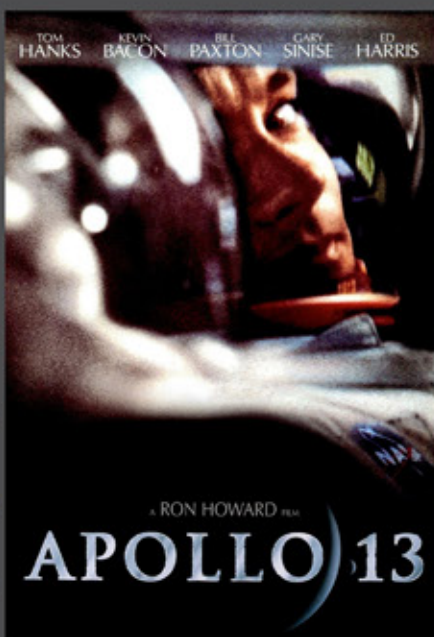
Wednesday, June 14 | 6:30-9 p.m.
