Parents and grandparents know that "Libraries Rock!" and by joining the summer reading program, children will acquire this same fondness for literacy.

The annual program is ongoing May 29-Aug. 4 and is filled with free programs and chances to earn great prizes. To sign up, children and teens, newborn to 17, and adults can register at any Tulsa City-County Library or online at www.TulsaLibrary.org/summer.

The program goes beyond the books by offering hundreds of family programs to expand the imagination. Performers and presenters from Tulsa and across the U.S. participate to help bring books to life. Children, as well as adults, will enjoy performances from Sugar Free Allstars, Mr. Stinky Feet, Monty Harper, Lucky Diaz, Tommy Terrific, magicians and many more entertaining and educational performers.



By visiting the library four times and reading eight books, children will earn a medal of achievement and a coupon booklet for free food and entertainment.
