Library staff getting questions about taxes

The library staff has been answering lots of questions about taxes this year. Here's all the information you need:

Federal Taxes

Federal tax forms 1040, 1040EZ, and 1040A now are available at all Tulsa City-County Library locations, including the Owasso Library.

Unfortunately, libraries are not able to offer customers copies of the tax instruction booklets this year. Due to recent budget cuts, the large number of booklets not being used, and the prevalence of taxpayers using software to file taxes, the IRS will no longer be printing tax booklets and providing them to libraries.

Taxpayers can access booklets online at www.irs.gov or by calling (800) 829-3676 to order a booklet.

State Taxes

The Oklahoma Tax Commission no Ionger provides forms or instructions to libraries or other organizations. Forms can be accessed online at www.tax.ok.gov.

At the Library

We have made in-house copies of the federal instruction booklets, which are about 70 pages, available at copiers in the library.

You also can print pages from the instruction booklet on library computers. The cost for copying or printing is 10 cents per page.

Additional information on state and federal taxes is available on the library's tax guide at guides.tulsalibrary.org/taxes.

At any Tulsa City-County Library location, you can use www.myfreetaxes.com. My Free Taxes is an online Volunteer Income Tax Assistance site that provides free online Federal tax filing for individuals or families with a combined income under \$60,000 in 2014.

Assistors will be answering questions from Monday-Saturday 9am to 9pm. Questions are answered in the order that they are received and responses are provided within 24 hours; more complex questions may require additional research.

In Owasso, free tax help is offered at the Owasso Community Center at 301 S, Cedar from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursdays.

There are also multiple locations in Tulsa offering free tax assistance. Please see the library tax guide at guides.tulsalibrary.org/taxes for more locations.

All sites offer electronic filing (E-file) using IRS provided tax preparation software. AARP/Tax Aide sites are open February to April 15. 2015.


