## **Author visits, reads to** Rejoice second graders

Stead was honored by the system and had the chance to visit three schools. He is author/illustrator of several books.

Books to Treasure gives all second graders a copy of the award winner's books each year," said Cheryl Golightly, RCS North Campus librarian. "Our students' copies of A Home For Bird were then autographed yesterday by Mr. Stead, as well as copies of his other books that are in the RCS Library."

Students appeared to get a lot out of Stead's visit, she said.

Students paid attention during Stead's visit, she said.
