The Da Vinci Code vs the Davidic Code

The Da Vinci Code was a runaway best seller of a fictional account of history for entertainment and profit. While the all time best seller (Bible) is being left on the shelf by many church-goers. Preachers refer to it less and less; emphasizing a religion that is based on the tongues of men,

preachers, feelings, entertainment, and spirits that are separated from God's Word.

Jesus called the Holy Spirit the Spirit of Truth – John 16:13: "When He, the Spirit of Truth, has come, He will guide you unto all truth...." In John 17:17 Jesus revealed the primary mission of His Heavenly Father through the Holy Spirit: "Sanctify them by Your truth Your Word is Truth."

The work of the Holy Spirit is inseparably connected to the Word of God. When pastors share counsel from the Bible, some Christians respond: "I'll wait till the Spirit tells me."

It is as if they believe the Holy Spirit can be separated from the Word of God. We are warned: "believe not every spirit, but test the spirits whether they are of God" 1 John 4:1. "Now the Spirit speaketh ex-

pressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devil" 1 Tim 4:1.

"How do we keep the Faith?" "Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." Romans 10:17. The Bible reveals to us whether the ministering spirit(s) or Pastor is of God or what Paul calls "...false apostles, deceitful workers transforming them

selves into apostles of Christ. And no wonder, for Satan himself transforms himself into an angel of light. Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also transform themselves into ministers of righteousness" 2 Cor. 11:13-15.

We who have opportunity to share and teach the Word of God must allow the Word of God to become flesh in the sense of being lived out in our lives and minis-

try through the indwelling Spirit of Truth. Paul challenges us: "...How shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? ... How shall they hear without a preacher? ...So faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." Romans 10:14-15, & 17. The Da Vidic (Davidic) Code is found in Ps. 119:105. "Your Word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path! Let's live it and Share it!
