## Novel Talk - I AM HUMAN: Individual Empowerment from 1920 to Today

Laura Mariarty, author and professor of Creative Writing at the University of Kansas, will discuss what connects us and what keeps us apart. Her talk will explore issues of women's rights, gay rights, and human rights in general. Mariarty is the author of four books, including "The Chaperone," in which she delivers a strong message of human equality and dignity using both real and fictional characters to tell the story of one Kansas woman's delayed coming of age as she serves as a chaperone to New York in the 1920s.
