This enables it to serve God and one another. One individual that embodies this philosophy was honored for her work by LeadingAge Oklahoma, the Oklahoma state association of not-for-profit senior living organizations.

Baptist Village of Owasso's Norma Whitaker was named resident volunteer of the year.

Whitaker found her place of ministry in 1987. Baptist Village of Owasso was opening a village store and needed someone to run it. Norma and husband Gale stepped in.

"I really went into it blind," Norma recalls. "I'd never [operated a store] before. My dad did have a store after he left the farm, and that was my only experience."

Nearly 27 years later, she's still going strong. She refers to it as her "mission" and it has become her place to serve.

Largely through her efforts, residents can shop for a wide variety of items without leaving campus.

It truly is remarkable the work that goes into daily operation. Norma purchases the products and spends hours stocking and pricing items. She uses coupons and sales to keep prices low while still being profitable. She coordinates a volunteer network to keep the store running Monday through Friday.

One-hundred percent of store profit goes right back into village ministry. The store has donated more than \$31,000 throughout the years toward various projects and campus improvements. The amount of labor put in more than 26 years is astounding, but she doesn't want attention brought to herself. She just enjoys seeing residents maintain their independence.

Norma was honored for service, but this passion is carried our by more than 750 friends Team Members every day, as they serve more than 2,200 people every day across Oklahoma.
