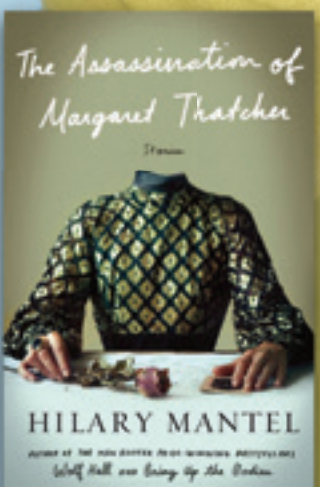
Winner of the 2018 PEGGY V. HELMERICH DISTINGUISHED AUTHOR AWARD

One of England’s greatest living novelists, Dame Hilary Mantel is the two-time winner of the Man Booker Prize for her internationally renowned *Wolf Hall* (2009) and its sequel *Bring Up the Bodies* (2012). The Man Booker Committee praised the series as “one of the greatest achievements of modern literature.” For the past two years, Dame Hilary has been working intensely on the final installment of the best-selling *Wolf Hall* trilogy about the rise of Thomas Cromwell in the court of King Henry VIII. She aims to publish the third book, *The Mirror and the Light*, in fall 2019. Dame Hilary’s prestigious works include drama, historical fiction, nonfiction, poetry and short stories.
