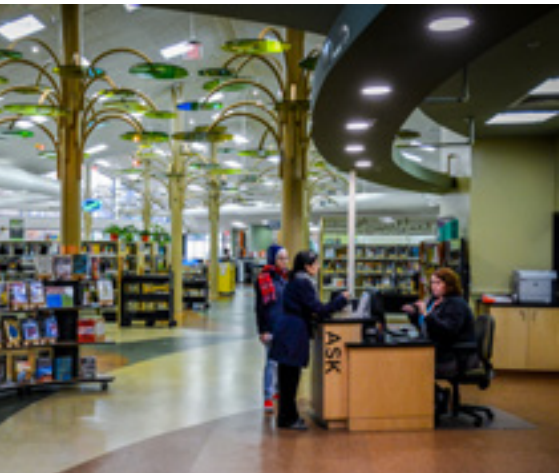
In addition to Patteson and Davis, the Herman and Kate Kaiser team includes: Mark Cotner,

Located at 5202 S. Hudson Ave., the Herman and Kate Kaiser Library opened in the summer of 2008 after the Tulsa Library Trust completed an extensive fundraising campaign to raise \$2.4 million in private funds for construction. The library was named after the Kaisers as the Herman Kaiser Foundation donated 51 percent of the construction cost. The library shares a lobby with the Buddy LaFortune Community Center.

The library offers a variety of free programming each month, including a weekly Build A Reader Storytime, followed by Stay and Play, for ages 0-5; a monthly PAWS for Reading

program, featuring registered therapy dog Merlin; a new book discussion called “It’s Me Again, Hank the Cowdog” for ages 5 and older and their families; “Creative Truths,” a monthly history book discussion for adults; and weekly “Gamezone” for teens. 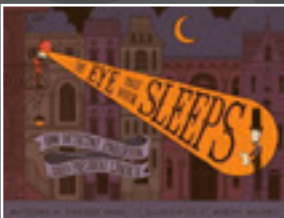
