Lesson Plan: Small changes make a difference! A lesson in positive action from The Smallest Girl in the Smallest Grade

• Overview

In Justin Roberts' *The Smallest Girl in the Smallest Grade*, illustrated by Christian Robinson, an observant little girl notices and later calls attention to the bullying she sees in her school. Merely by speaking up, the little girl begins a cycle of positive change. Small actions make a difference, and even the littlest people are capable of big things. In this lesson, students will be empowered to find their own small ways to make a difference in the world.

- Resources & Preparation
 - Materials and Technology
 - The book, The Smallest Girl in the Smallest Grade
 - Paper and writing utensils for journaling
- Instructional Plan
 - Student Objectives:
 - Brainstorm ways to make a difference in the world
 - Practice small acts of kindness over one week or more
 - Journal the results
- 1. Read *The Smallest Girl in the Smallest Grade* together as a class.
- 2. Discuss the story together. Emphasize how even a small person can make a big difference in the world.
- 3. Review examples of ways to make a difference such as those in the articles listed under additional resources. Discuss how some of these examples could be adapted for your area or for younger students.
- 4. Have students choose one attainable example that they can work on every day for a week or more.
- 5. Set aside a few minutes of class time every day for students to journal about what they did and how it made them feel.
- 6. See how long you can get them to keep it up.
