Meet Amairani Perez,

New Hispanic Resource Center Coordinator

“The library has played a vital role in my upbringing and serves as a major motivation for the work that I will be able to do as the new coordinator for the center.”

As a child and young adult, Amairani Perez spent every Saturday with her family at the Martin Regional Library, where she vicariously visited other worlds through a variety of literature, while her father sat in the Hispanic Resource Center, reading the latest issue of the political magazine *Proceso*, which was heavily censored in her home country, Mexico.

“My father would then take the information that he had read and give our family members an update about the political climate, which they often knew nothing about despite living in the country where the magazine was published,” said Perez, the new coordinator for Tulsa City-County Library’s Hispanic Resource Center.

Originally from Acapulco, Perez grew up in Tulsa, and graduated from Jenks High School and earned her higher education degrees from Tulsa Community College and Oklahoma State University. Most recently, she worked as a field coordinator for Unidos Se Puede, a mentorship program that works to empower Hispanic students to graduate from high school and pursue higher education.

“The library has played a vital role in my upbringing and serves as a major motivation for the work that I will be able to do as the new coordinator for the center,” said Perez. “I am dedicated to introducing ideas that will foster the preservation of the diverse Hispanic culture and encourage individuals to reach



their potential when it comes to literacy, education and personal advancement.”

She especially would love to see a resurgence of the Hispanic Resource Center as an in-demand resource. Established in 1999, the purpose of the Hispanic Resource Center is to provide Spanish language resources, programming and services, and to celebrate Hispanic culture. The center provides access to more than 8,000 Spanish language books, media, magazines and newspapers for all ages.

In regards to the local and national discussion of what it means to be Latinx in this country, Perez said, “there is plenty of room for the center to become a place where families and individuals,

regardless of their place of origin, can come to the library to expand their knowledge and understanding of an ever-changing world.”

Perez is committed to enlisting the voice of the community in order to recognize the need for materials, programming and services that the center can provide as resources for the customer. Currently, she is in the process of welcoming several new partnerships to the center’s advisory committee. To date, confirmed organizations on the committee include Oklahoma Center for Community and Justice, City of Tulsa, Oklahomans for Equality, Tulsa Public Schools and the Hispanic American Foundation, to name just a few. In the future, she would love to form a customer advisory

committee so that the Hispanic community can make better use of all the wonder Spanish language materials the center has to offer.

Located at the Martin Regional Library at 26th and Garnett, the Hispanic Resource Center is open year-round Monday through Thursday, 9 a.m. to 9 p.m.; Friday, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Saturday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.; and Sunday, 1 to 5 p.m.

If you haven’t had a chance yet to see the center or if it has been a long time since you last visited, be sure to stop by and check out its new look and say hello to Perez, if she is there.
