Every March, Tulsa City-County Library's American Indian Resource Center (AIRC) presents the American Indian Festival of Words to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of American Indians through a series of enlightening family programs. This year's festival features the 2020 American Indian Circle of Honor presentation honoring Walter Echo-Hawk, an enrolled member of the Pawnee Nation, who has been a Native American rights attorney since 1973.

"Walter Echo-Hawk has devoted his life and expertise to the indigenous cultures locally and throughout the world," said AIRC coordinator Teresa Runnels. "It is a great honor to recognize him for his work in preserving tribal and cultural sovereignty, social justice and religious freedom."

Induction into the Circle of Honor is a celebration of the honoree's actions in the face of adversity, commitment to the preservation of American Indian culture and legacy for future generations.

Echo-Hawk has represented various Oklahoma tribes; served as a justice on the Supreme Courts of the Pawnee Nation and Kickapoo Nation; taught federal Indian law at The University of Tulsa, Lewis & Clark and University of Hawaii law schools. He also serves as chairman of the board of directors for the Association of Tribal Archives, Libraries and Museums and is on the "Knowledge Givers" advisory board for Oklahoma's American Indian Cultural Center and Museum.

Echo-Hawk's books include: In the Courts of the Conqueror: The 10 Worst Indian Law Cases Ever Decided (2010); In the Light of Justice: The Rise of Human Rights in Native America & the UN Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (2013); and his newest title, The Sea of Grass: A Family Tale From the American Heartland (2018), which is described as a "novelized account of the lives and times

of real people whose lives were shaped by the land, animals and plants of the Central Plains and by the long sweep of Pawnee history in the grasslands."

The Circle of Honor alternates annually with the American Indian Festival of Words Writers Award. Past Circle of Honor recipients include Charles Chibitty, Wilma Mankiller, Neal McCaleb, Billy Mills, Kirke Kickingbird, Ruthe Blalock Jones, Sam Proctor and Dr. Henrietta Mann.

Housed at TCCL's Zarrow Regional Library, the AIRC provides access to more than 4,000 books, periodicals, and media for adults and children by and about American Indians, including historical and rare materials, new releases, films and music with a focus on native languages.

"We are one of only two centers in public libraries across the nation that provides cultural, educational and informational resources, activities and services highlighting American Indian culture," said Runnels. "We strive to keep all of our programming traditional but make it relevant to today's society."

As the only center of its kind in the state, the AIRC is vital to Oklahoma's many tribes. The AIRC is open year-round seven days a week. For more details, visit www.tulsalibrary.org/airc.






