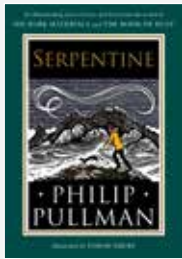
The Constitution Decoded By Katie Kennedy

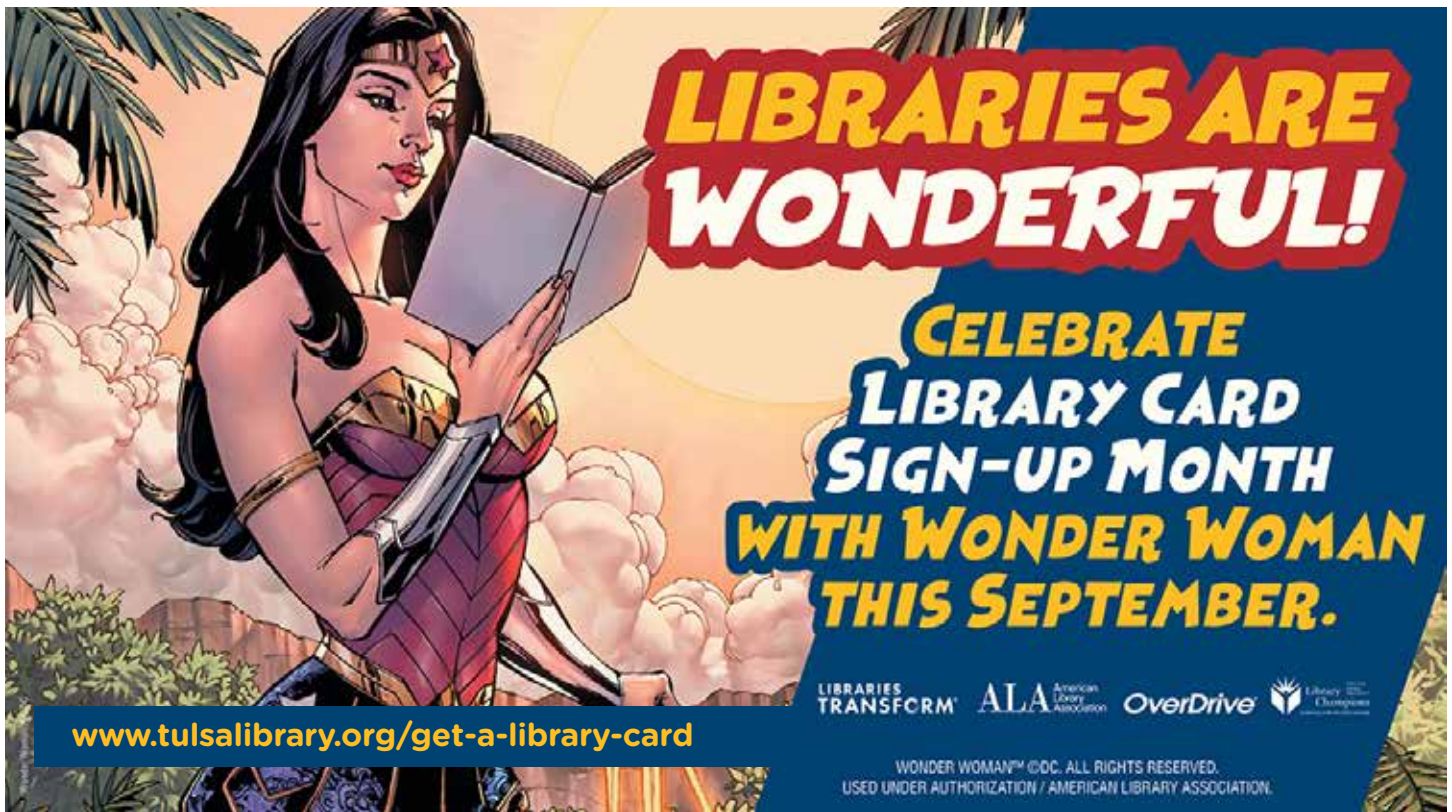
