Start the school year strong with **after-school bound of the school year strong with bound of the school year strong w**

Homework can be a hassle and a stressor for many students any time of year, especially as they transition back to school from summer break. Tulsa City-County Library is here to help your child start the school year strong with the After-School Homework Club! Registration opens Sept. 1.

The After-School Homework Club (ASHC) provides children with a positive learning experience inside the library. This free service is for students in third through eighth grade who need one-to-one help completing homework assignments in any subject. Registering for the program provides your child with weekly 30-minute tutor sessions, and all you need is a TCCL library card!

At the start of the 2021 school year, Brendy Fuentes realized her thirdgrade daughter Alison needed help with her homework. "She was very behind in reading, so I started looking at options to strengthen her reading skills," Fuentes said. That's how they found the After-School Homework Club.

Fuentes enrolled Alison in the service, and they met weekly with a tutor at Martin Regional Library from September 2021 through April 2022. Thanks to these sessions, Alison went

up one whole reading level at school. For this reason, Fuentes believes other children can benefit from the After-School Homework Club.

Fuentes likes how the service has improved her daughter's reading skills and confidence. She also likes that the After-School Homework Club is free, and that she can read in the library while her daughter is in the tutoring sessions.

"I highly recommend this program because it's very good," she said. "Alison has advanced a lot in reading." "It's fun, and I like getting my grades up," Alison added. She also received math help to tackle homework dealing with addition, subtraction and multiplication.

Though her siblings are younger, Alison looks forward to when they are old enough to use the ASHC. "When he's 8, he can come get help, too," Alison said of her little brother. While Alison is receiving tutoring, her siblings visit the library to check out books.

Weekly tutor sessions are offered Monday-Thursday from Sept. 12, 2022, through April 27, 2023, at five TCCL locations: Broken Arrow Library, Brookside Library, Kendall-Whittier Library, Maxwell Park Library and

Martin Regional Library.

To enroll your child in the ASHC, register online starting Sept. 1 at **www.tulsalibrary.org/after-schoolhomework-club**. Once an online application is submitted, the After-School Homework Club coordinator will contact parents/guardians to set up a time for them to meet with the site facilitator to complete paperwork.

Become a volunteer homework coach!



In order to provide this much-needed service, the library asks the community for volunteers and homework coaches to work with students at any one of our After-School Homework Club locations. Volunteer homework coaches provide support and assistance to children in grades three through eight who need a little extra help with their homework assignments. These activities take place at one of the library's five After-School Homework Club sites: Broken Arrow Library, Brookside Library, Kendall-Whittier Library, Maxwell Park Library and Martin Regional Library.

At each site, homework coaches work alongside the After-School Homework Club facilitators.

After applying, volunteer coaches are provided an orientation to library resources and are trained on how to ask children the right questions to best support their homework needs.

Volunteer requirements:

- At least 18 years old
- Must be able to commit to weekly 30-minute sessions, Monday-Thursday, Sept. 12, 2022, through April 27, 2023
- Must be self-directed, culturally sensitive and a positive role model for the children with whom they work
- Must be computer and internet literate
- Must be able to write clearly and concisely
- Must have a knowledge of basic school subjects including reading, English, writing, science and mathematics

What is the Build A Reader program?

The Build A Reader program helps establish a basis for reading and learning success in children from birth to pre-K through these key activities: talking, playing, singing, reading and writing. Research shows that regularly doing these five things will prepare your child to enter kindergarten with better language and learning comprehension skills ... and that's where our storytimes come in!

Our Build A Reader storytimes are led by professional library staff trained in supporting children's literacy and learning development. Parents learn, too, as storytime leaders demonstrate how and why to incorporate talking, singing, reading, writing and playing when interacting with your children.

Who is storytime for?

Six different storytime types are offered to meet the needs of all burgeoning young readers ages birth to 5 – as well as parents and guardians! Storytime types include Babies (ages 0-2), Toddlers, Babies & Toddlers, Preschool, Family (ages 0-5) and Bilingual (English and Spanish).

How and when can you and your child attend storytime?

Storytimes are on break during August but will resume in September. Check back to view listings in the September Event Guide or ask the children's librarian at your favorite TCCL location!
