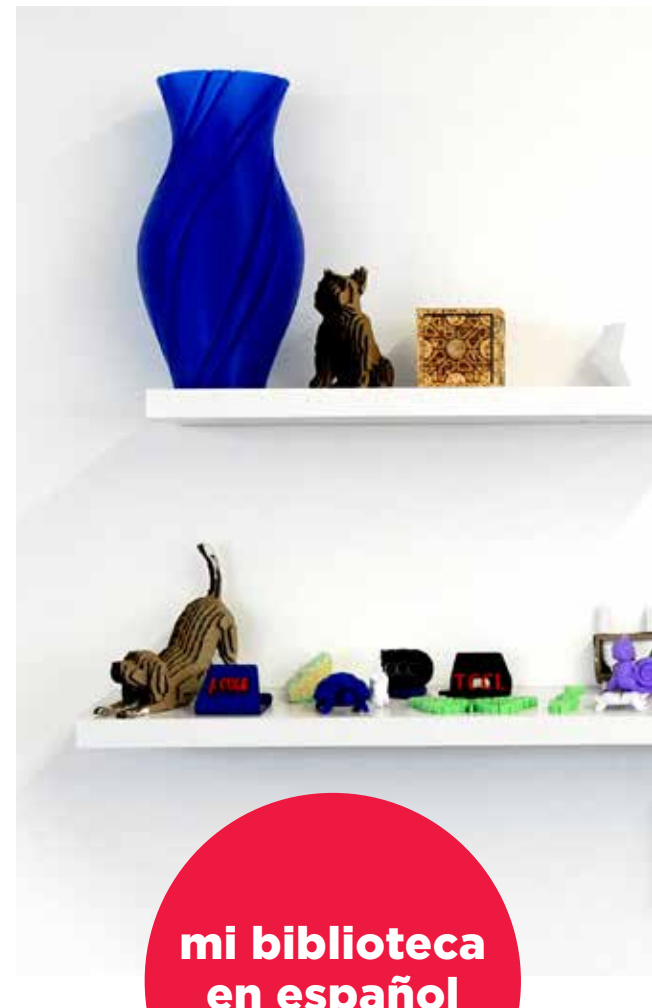

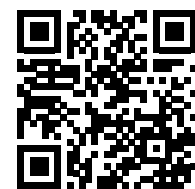

Stay up to date on current events across the country and the world with free newspaper access through PressReader.

**WHAT IT IS:** PressReader is an online resource and app that lets you access newspapers remotely. It offers newspapers and magazines from 145 countries and in 65 languages to keep you up to date on happenings around the world.

**HOW TO USE IT:** Access PressReader online at [www.tulsalibrary.org/digital](http://www.tulsalibrary.org/digital). To read PressReader content, click “Sign in” and then click “Library or Group” to search for Tulsa City-County Library.

Once selected, enter your TCCL card number and PIN (the same PIN used to log in to the library website). You also can download the PressReader app from your mobile device’s app store.

Local artist collective Black Moon uses equipment in the Maker Space for a variety of artistic endeavors. The vinyl cutter has helped with window logos for their studio and exhibit titles for new shows. They have even made sellable merchandise in the Maker Space, like stickers and ornaments.

**WHAT IT IS:** The Maker Space, located at Central Library, is a hands-on, creator-focused space and provides visitors a place to work on their next great idea, develop a new skill or learn a new hobby in a supportive environment. It offers 3D printing, laser engraving, a vinyl cutter, screen printing, sewing machines, soldering stations, an audio recording studio and more.

**HOW TO USE IT:** To get an orientation appointment and use equipment in the Maker Space, email [MakerSpace@tulsalibrary.org](mailto:MakerSpace@tulsalibrary.org) or call 918-549-7442.

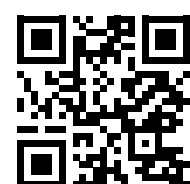
# Play more

**WHAT IT IS:** ArtistWorks provides world-class instruction from Grammy Award-winning music professionals and offers users a guided path of video lessons containing everything they need to reach their musical goals. All levels of player are welcome.

**HOW TO USE IT:** You can access ArtistWorks through Libby, available online at [www.libbyapp.com](http://www.libbyapp.com) or through the app on your device. (Simply search for “Libby” in your device’s app store to download the app.) Log in to Libby with your TCCL card number to find ArtistWorks on Libby’s homepage in the “Extras” section. Once you access ArtistWorks, you will have full access to its content for 30 days. When it expires, you can get access again through Libby.

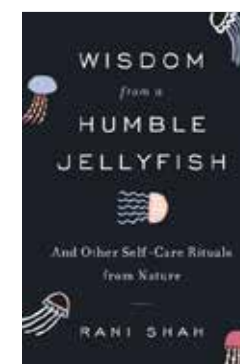

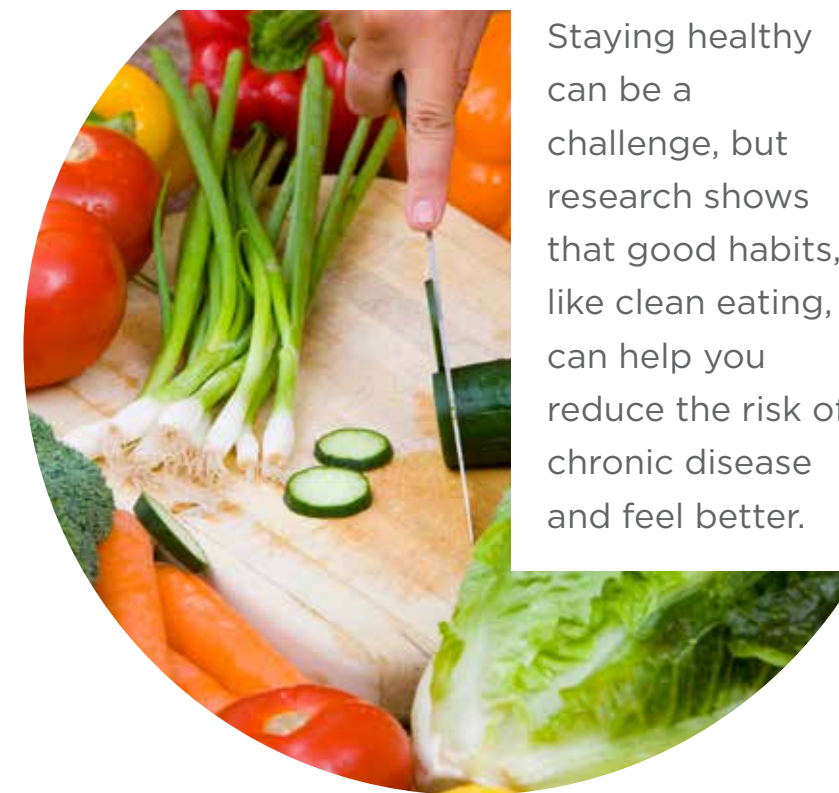

## Use Medline Plus to start and keep healthy habits!



Staying healthy can be a challenge, but research shows that good habits, like clean eating, can help you reduce the risk of chronic disease and feel better.

**WHAT IT IS:** Medline Plus is a free online resource with information on health topics, drugs, directories and dictionaries to help you find the health info you need.

Medline Plus recipes show you how to prepare tasty, healthy meals that help you develop a healthy eating pattern. Browse recipes by meal (breakfast, lunch, dinner or snacks) or by categories, such as dairy free, low fat, gluten sensitive, low sodium, soups and more.

**HOW TO USE IT:**
