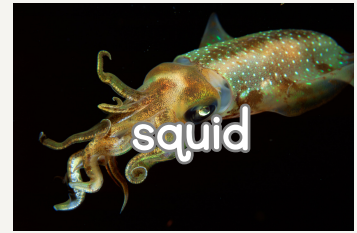

Collective Nouns OF THE SEA

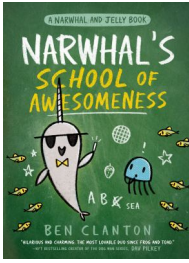
Cut out the collective nouns and match them to the marine animal..

Collective Nouns

Objective: Learn about and practice the collective nouns of many marine animals.

Collective Noun: a noun that denotes a group of individuals,
ex. a herd of cattle or a flock of geese

1. Define "collective noun" and encourage students to think of examples. Find the examples that Narwhal teaches on pages 33 and 34.
2. Review the list of marine animals and their collective nouns. Use the handout to let students cut out and place the collective nouns on the animal's picture. They can guess or you can use them together.
3. Practice with play. Call out the collective noun and students will act like that animal, i.e. will pretend to be a "shiver of sharks."
