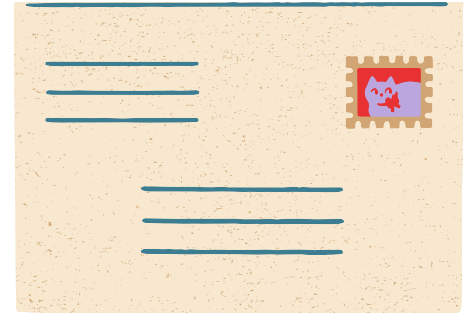


Tell a story to a friend or family member.

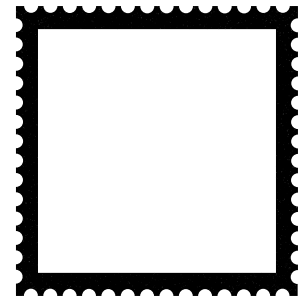
