## Meeting Rooms

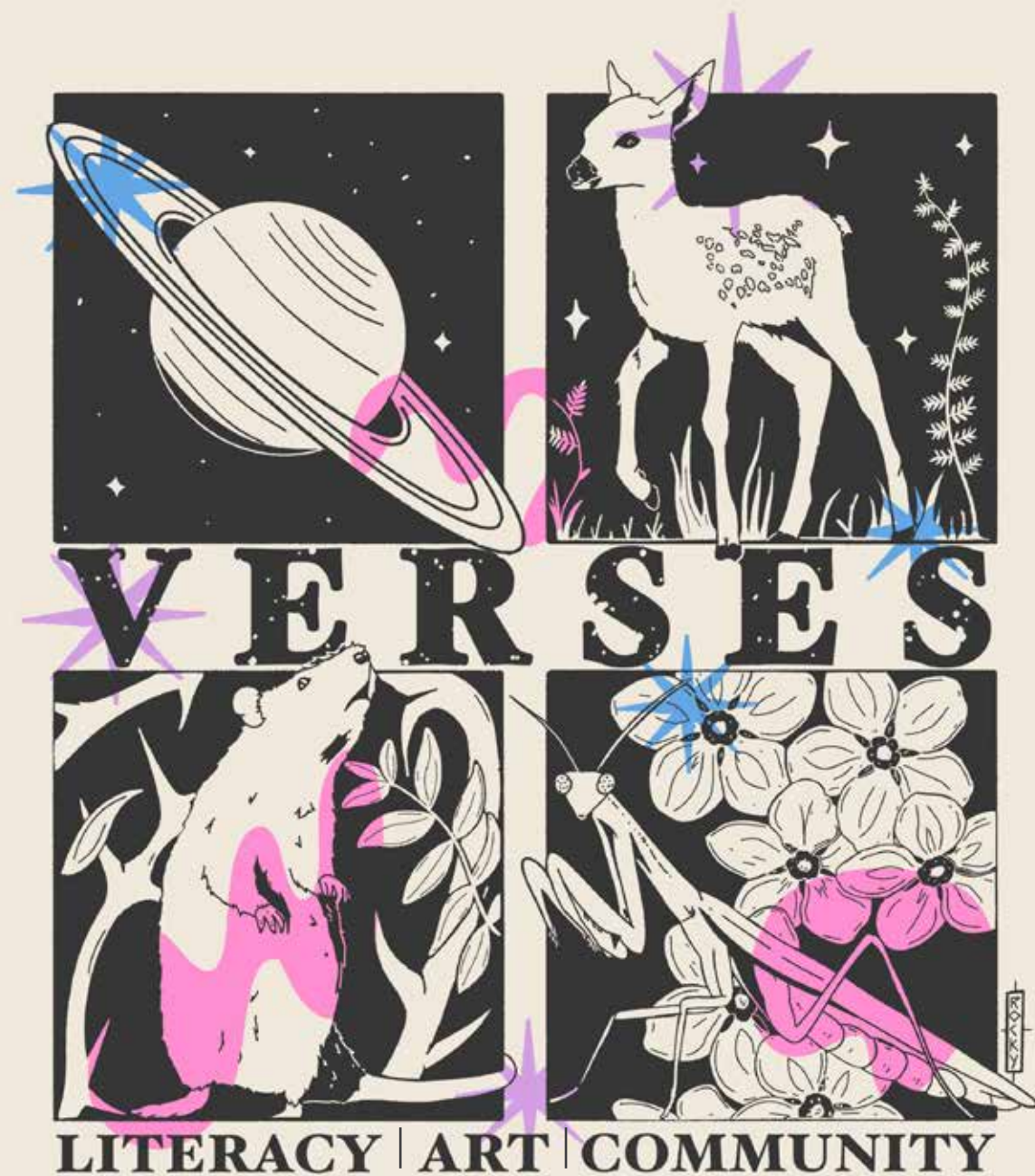

Guests will have the opportunity to savor delicious food and beverages from local eateries.



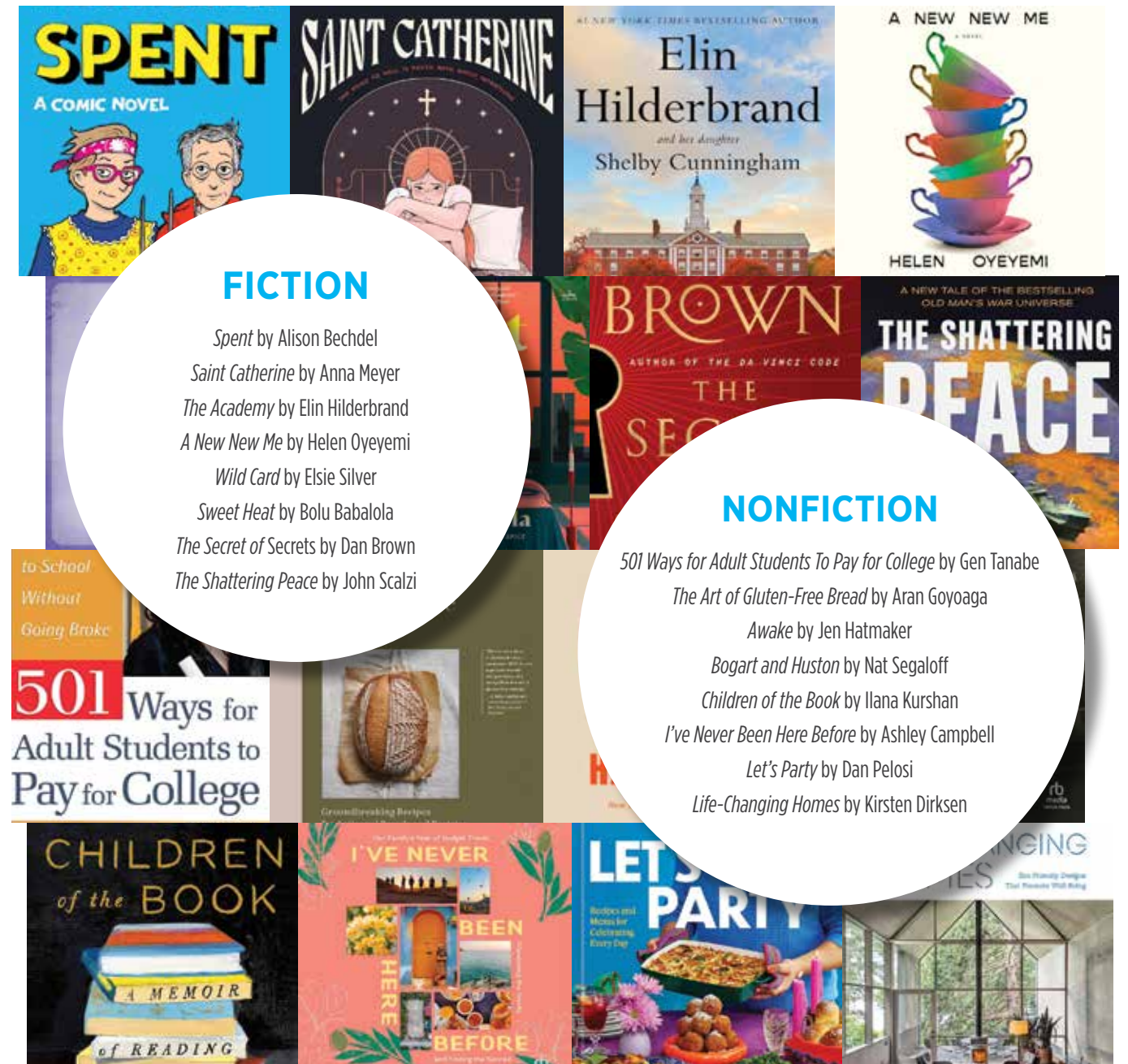
