On Oct. 23, the Bronson Brookside Library officially opened its doors. The grand opening began with a ribbon cutting and continued throughout the day with live music from Miss Holly and her ukulele, caricature drawings, a teen art display, Mario Kart competitions, maker space demonstrations, a prize raffle and more.

"We are thrilled to open this branch to the Tulsa community and invite everyone to come see what a modern library looks and feels like," said TCCL CEO Kimberly Johnson. "No matter your interest — whether you're exploring a new hobby, advancing your education, applying for a job or starting a business — there is something for everyone, and we are here to help."

The first branch completed as part of the MY Library, OUR Future campaign, the Bronson Brookside Library is named in honor of the late Donald Bronson Atkins.

The new 15,000-square-foot library, located at 4607 S. Madison Place, was designed with community, creativity and comfort in mind, offering a wide range of spaces and amenities for all ages. Visitors are welcomed through the Peggy Helmerich Lobby, which features thoughtful book displays, self-check stations, a holds area, a laptop dispenser and the Ask desk. Nearby, the adaptable Activity Room can host a variety of programs, including maker space activities.

The Anne & Henry Zarrow
Foundation Children's Area invites
families to explore the expanded
children's collection through
colorful book bins and a gardenthemed design. Interactive learning
centers and activity stations
encourage literacy development,
while four dedicated children's
computers offer opportunities
for digital exploration. Just
outside the children's area is the
Huck's Hideaway Children's Patio,
sponsored by the Hardesty Family

Foundation. The outdoor space features a whimsical road design, children's tricycles and plenty of space to play.

Teens have their own spot to hang out and create in the Teen Area, which features a dedicated collection, comfy seating, a Wi-Fi bar and an interactive Everbright board. It's also near the life-size chessboard, which welcomes all ages and skill levels to play an immersive game of chess.

For adults, the Sanford & Irene
Burnstein Family Foundation
Outdoor Adult Reading Space
provides a quiet retreat complete
with oversized lounge chairs. Inside,
customers have access to 19 public
computers throughout the building,
and the Business Center makes it
easy to get things done with faxing,
copying and scanning services.

Customers looking for collaboration or quiet study will find four uniquely designed huddle rooms. The Large Community Meeting Room, equipped with a projector, can accommodate up to 50 guests and is available for community reservations.

Despite being one of the smallest branches in Tulsa City-County Library's system, the original Brookside Library consistently ranked sixth in foot traffic among TCCL's 24 branches. With double the space, enhanced amenities and new opportunities for connection, the Bronson Brookside Library is poised to serve even more customers while preserving the community spirit that made the original branch so loved.

Located just one block south of its original location at 1207
E. 45th Place, the \$9.4 million
Bronson Brookside Library was funded through a combination of foundation grants, corporate support and individual donations.
Major donors include Bob and Leslie Pritchard, The Anne & Henry Zarrow Foundation, The Helmerich Trust, the Hardesty Family
Foundation and the Sanford & Irene Burnstein Family Foundation.

The Bronson Brookside Library's new chapter is officially underway. Come and be part of it by stopping by and exploring all that it has to offer!





Q&A With Hernan Diaz

Since 1985, TCCL has bestowed the Peggy V. Helmerich Distinguished Author Award on some of the world's most prestigious authors. How did you feel when you first learned that you were selected as the 2025 Peggy V. Helmerich Distinguished Author Award recipient?

It defies belief to find one's name in a list including so many heroes, from Toni Morrison to Kazuo Ishiguro, from Ian McEwan to Hilary Mantel. Just imagine a list from which one could produce such names at random. It is also quite special to be honored by the Tulsa City-County Library. I've always worked at libraries, and I still do. I have an unpayable debt of gratitude to the librarians and curators that have helped me through the years, and their service to their communities should always be remembered and praised.

Tell us a little bit about yourself. Where were you born? Where did you grow up? What were your interests? Were you a big reader? If so, what types of books did you like to read?

I was born in Buenos Aires, Argentina, but moved to Stockholm, Sweden, at the age of 2. Although we spoke Spanish at home, Swedish was my first social language and, also, the language in which I read my first books and wrote my first short stories. I was a precocious reader, and there was a lot of Astrid Lindgren throughout my childhood. Also, many comics, among which Tintin (in Swedish translation) left a deep impression. Soon, I moved on to adventure novels – Jules Verne, Edgar Rice Burroughs, Emilio Salgari, Robert Louis Stevenson. The big shift came when I discovered that a true literary adventure doesn't take place in the plot but in language itself. This happened around age 10, with the discovery of authors such as Julio Cortázar, Edgar Allan Poe and Jorge Luis Borges.

When did you first get interested in writing? What inspired you to become a writer?

I've always wanted to be a writer. Even before I learned how to write, I knew that words were my thing. I grew up in a rather bookish home, which helped. But as a child, I never wanted to become an astronaut or a firefighter. An unexplainable love of language, which has been with me forever, was my motivation.

You published your first novel, *In the Distance*, at age 44. What was your profession prior to becoming a published author? Are you a full-time writer now?

While writing fiction nonstop to have it be rejected absolutely everywhere, I was an academic and sometimes critic. I taught at different universities until I got a position at Columbia as editor of one of their academic journals. It was a great job, because it gave me a lot of freedom. I wrote four books in my windowless basement office on West 116th Street. I left that job about a year ago, and now I am, for the first time in my life, what I've always wanted to be: a full-time writer. It took a while ...

When you are not writing, what do you like to do in your downtime? I don't have downtime.
