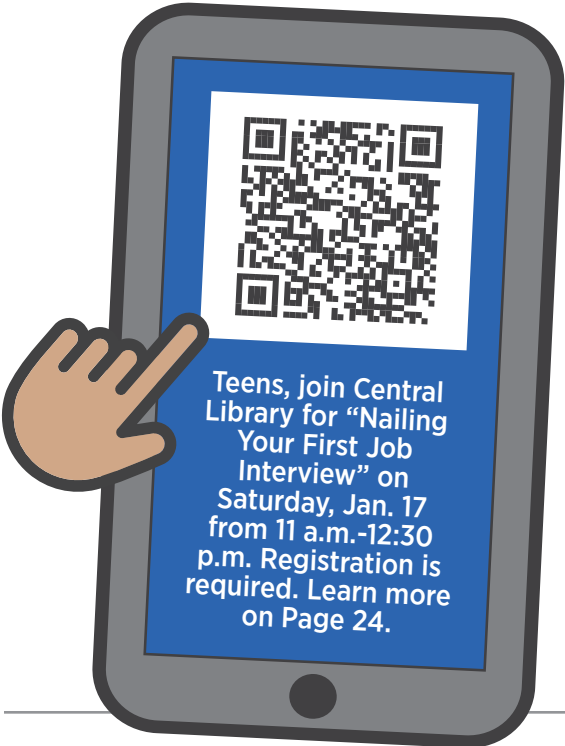
your strengths and job matches, and find résumé templates to help craft a standout job application. If you’re sharpening your skills for a new position or career change, **LearningExpress Library** is another

For aspiring business owners and entrepreneurs, TCCL's Grow Academy provides a structured path to success.

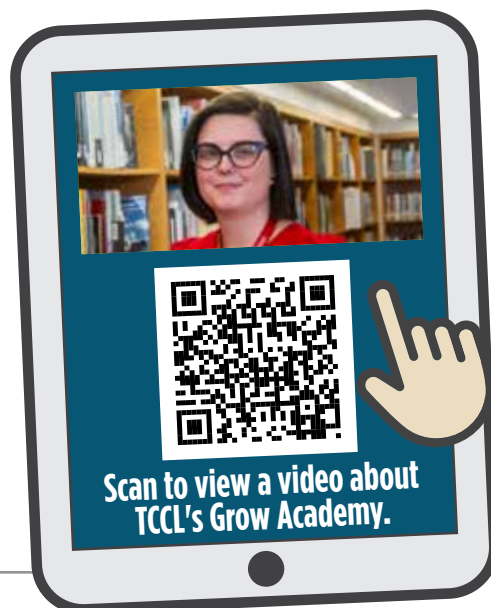

"We spend time on everything from business plans to market research, ensuring local businesses have the resources they need to thrive."

Grow Academy events take place one Saturday per month at Central

Library, February through June. The classes guide participants through every step of building a business plan, supported by expert instruction and hands-on use of library and community resources. Each event features industry professionals who share insights on marketing, funding and business development. Admitted participants receive a digital workbook to track their progress, and those who complete all sessions earn a certificate of completion.

Gregory H. Bigler, Euchee, enrolled with the Muscogee Nation of Oklahoma, is a tribal judge and lawyer who exclusively represents Native American tribes. He devotes much of his time to the Polecat Euchee Ceremonial Grounds and has led efforts in Euchee language revitalization and tribal law advocacy, including the implementation of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and expanded jurisdiction under the Violence Against Women Act. He is the author of *Rabbit Decolonizes the Forest: Stories From the Euchee Reservation*, published in 2024.

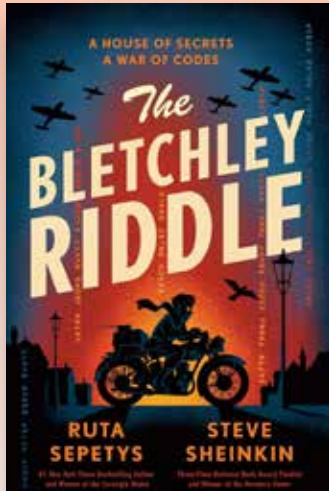

sesiones de debate del grupo ni recibirán un certificado de finalización. Los espacios son limitados y se pueden reservar en www.tulsalibrary.org/events.

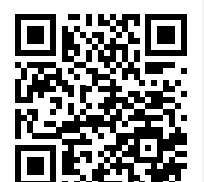

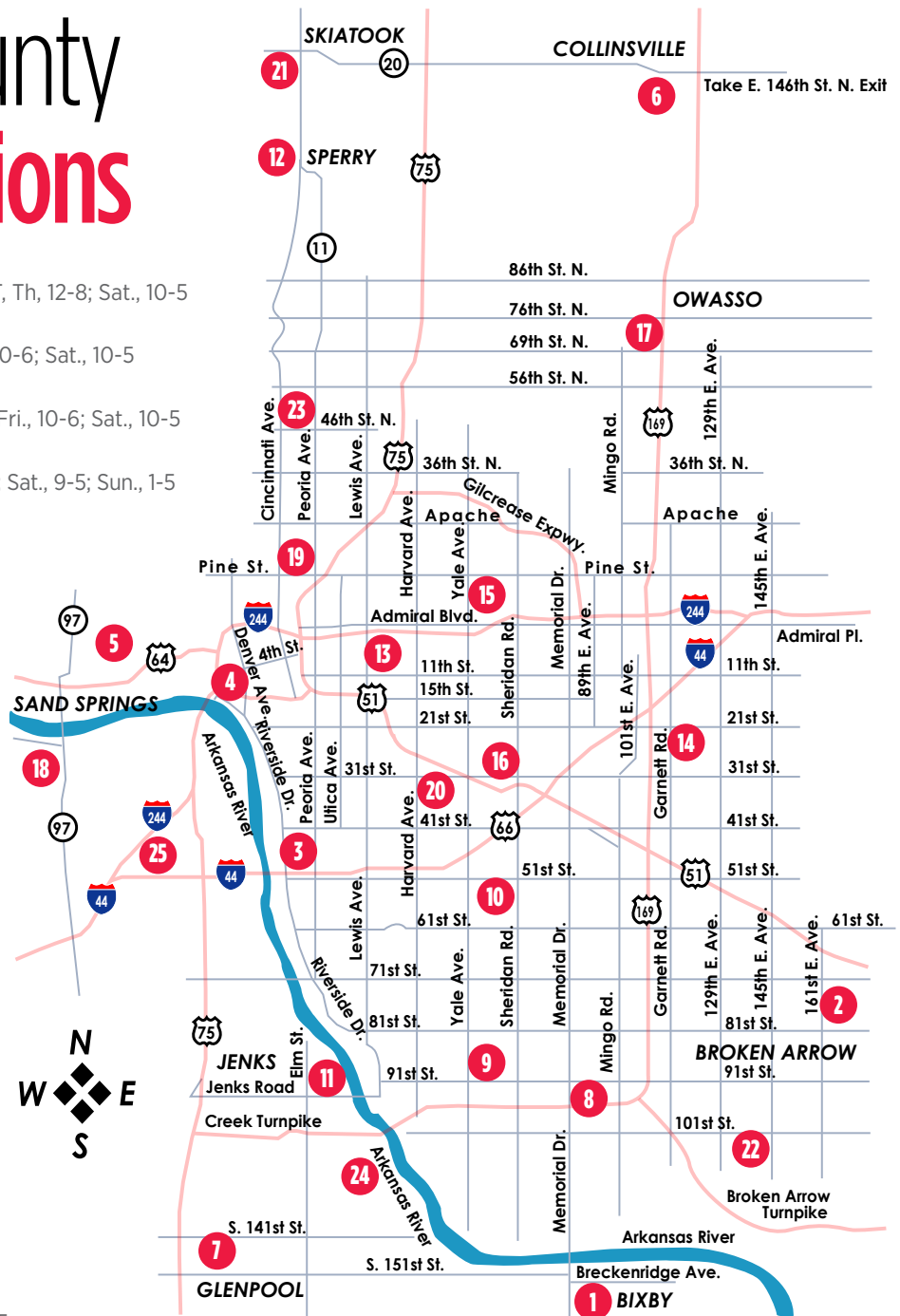
