Philbrook Museum is honoring Gordon Parks, famed African American photographer, with an exhibit opening Feb. 11, during Black History Month, and running through June 19. The African American Resource Center is partnering with Philbrook Museum to highlight the literature of Parks, his subjects and the world he photographed. Experience the exhibit at the Philbrook Museum and then visit the African American Resource Center at Rudisill Regional Library for further reading and additional resources on Parks’ incredible work. One of the most influential photographers of the 20th century, Parks (1912-2006) was also renowned as a poet, filmmaker, author, composer and activist. He is best known for his photojournalism from the 1940s to the 1970s that documented American life and culture, particularly the experiences of African Americans and the Civil Rights Movement. The exhibition features more than 70 photographs, including images captured by Parks for photojournalism and fashion assignments at *LIFE* magazine, striking portraits of prominent figures such as Malcolm X and Muhammad Ali, as well as examples of his experimental photography. The exhibition is organized by the Marianna Kistler Beach Museum of Art, Kansas State University. Generous support provided by Art Bridges. For all ages.






