Yuyi Morales Hummingbird Award in Literary Arts



On Saturday, Oct. 31, the Hispanic Resource Center will present the Hummingbird Award in Literary Arts to author and illustrator Yuyi Morales at Martin Regional Library. (See Page 10.)

Morales is known for creating stories that celebrate culture, identity, family and imagination while reflecting the richness and diversity of Latinx experiences. Her most recent book, *Little Rebels*, was a Caldecott Honor Book. Her other books include *Bright Star; Dreamers*, which won the Pura Belpré Illustrator Award; *Viva Frida*; and more.

Presented biennially, this award honors nationally prominent Latinx authors, poets and artists whose work elevates and affirms the voices of the Latinx community.

Oge Mora Books To Treasure

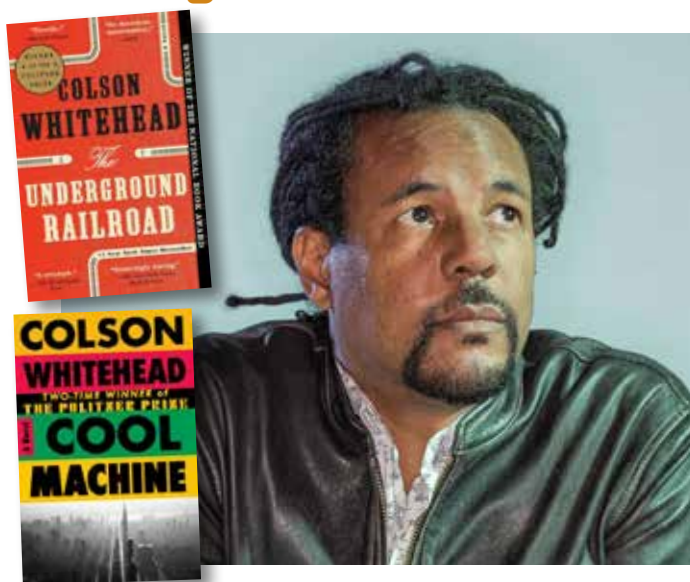
Award-winning author and illustrator Oge Mora will visit Hardesty Regional Library on Friday, Nov. 6 as the 2026 Books To Treasure featured illustrator. (See Page 26.)

Mora's warm, vibrant stories and distinctive collage artwork have earned national recognition. Her debut picture book, *Thank You, Omu!*, received numerous awards, including a Caldecott Honor and the 2019 Coretta Scott King Award. Her stories celebrate kindness, family and the power of communities coming together.

Since 2003, Books To Treasure has introduced Tulsa County second graders to outstanding children's literature. Through the program, students receive a free book, have the opportunity to obtain a special library card and meet a celebrated creator in person. Colson Whitehead Peggy V. Helmerich Distinguished Author Award



On Friday, Dec. 4, Colson Whitehead will receive the 2026 Peggy V. Helmerich Distinguished Author Award at a black-tie gala in his honor. He will give a free public presentation and book signing on Thursday, Dec. 3. Both presentations will take place at Central Library. (See Page 14.)

Whitehead is the author of numerous bestselling and critically acclaimed books, including *The Underground Railroad* and its sequel, *The Nickel Boys*, both of which received the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction. The third book in his Harlem trilogy, *Cool Machine*, was just released in July. Whitehead is one of only four writers to win the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction twice and has also received honors including a MacArthur Fellowship and the National Humanities Medal.

The Peggy V. Helmerich Distinguished Author Award recognizes internationally acclaimed authors whose body of work has made a major contribution to literature. Recent recipients include Hernan Diaz (2025), H. W. Brands (2024), Amor Towles (2023) and Ann Patchett (2022). Learn more at www.TulsaLibrary.org/HelmerichAward.



Cynthia Leitich Smith American Indian Writers Award

The 2027 American Indian Writers Award, presented by the American Indian Resource Center, will honor Cynthia Leitich Smith (Mvskoke Nation) on Saturday, March 6, kicking off the annual American Indian Festival of Words. (See Page 12.)

Smith's bestselling books for children and young adults have helped expand Native representation in contemporary literature. Her young adult novels include *Harvest House*, *Hearts Unbroken*, the Feral series and more. Smith's works for children include easy picture books such as *Firefly Season*, *Here Come the Aunties!* and *Jingle Dancer*, among others, and chapter books such as *Indian Shoes*, *Sisters of the Neversea*, *On a Wing and a Tear* and more. She is also the author-curator of Heartdrum, a publishing imprint that champions Indigenous stories and creators.

Established in 2001, the biennial American Indian Writers Award is dedicated to recognizing the achievements of American Indian writers. 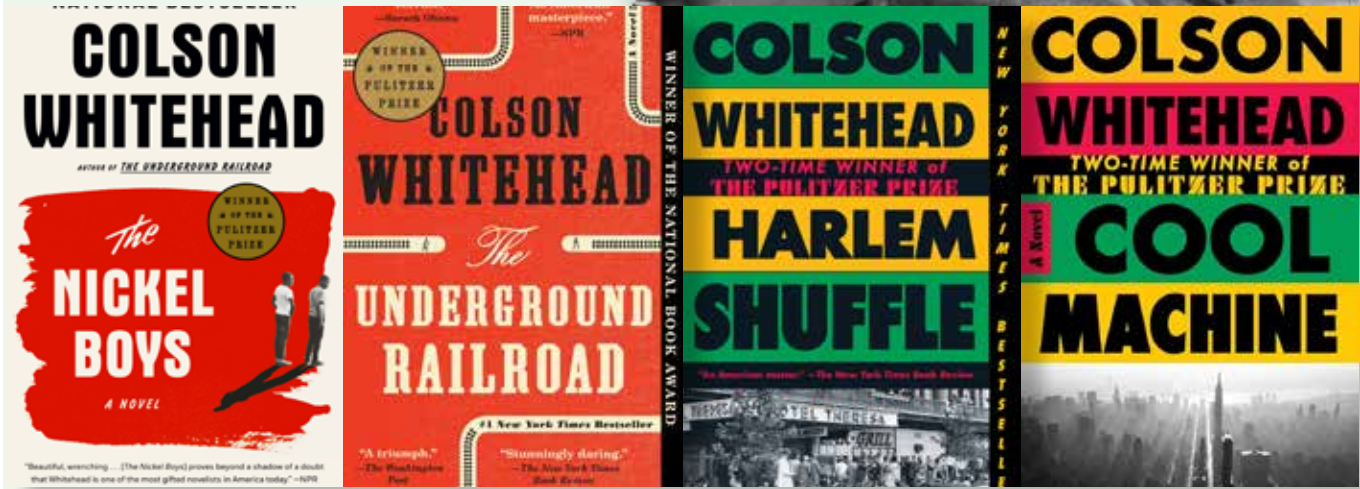

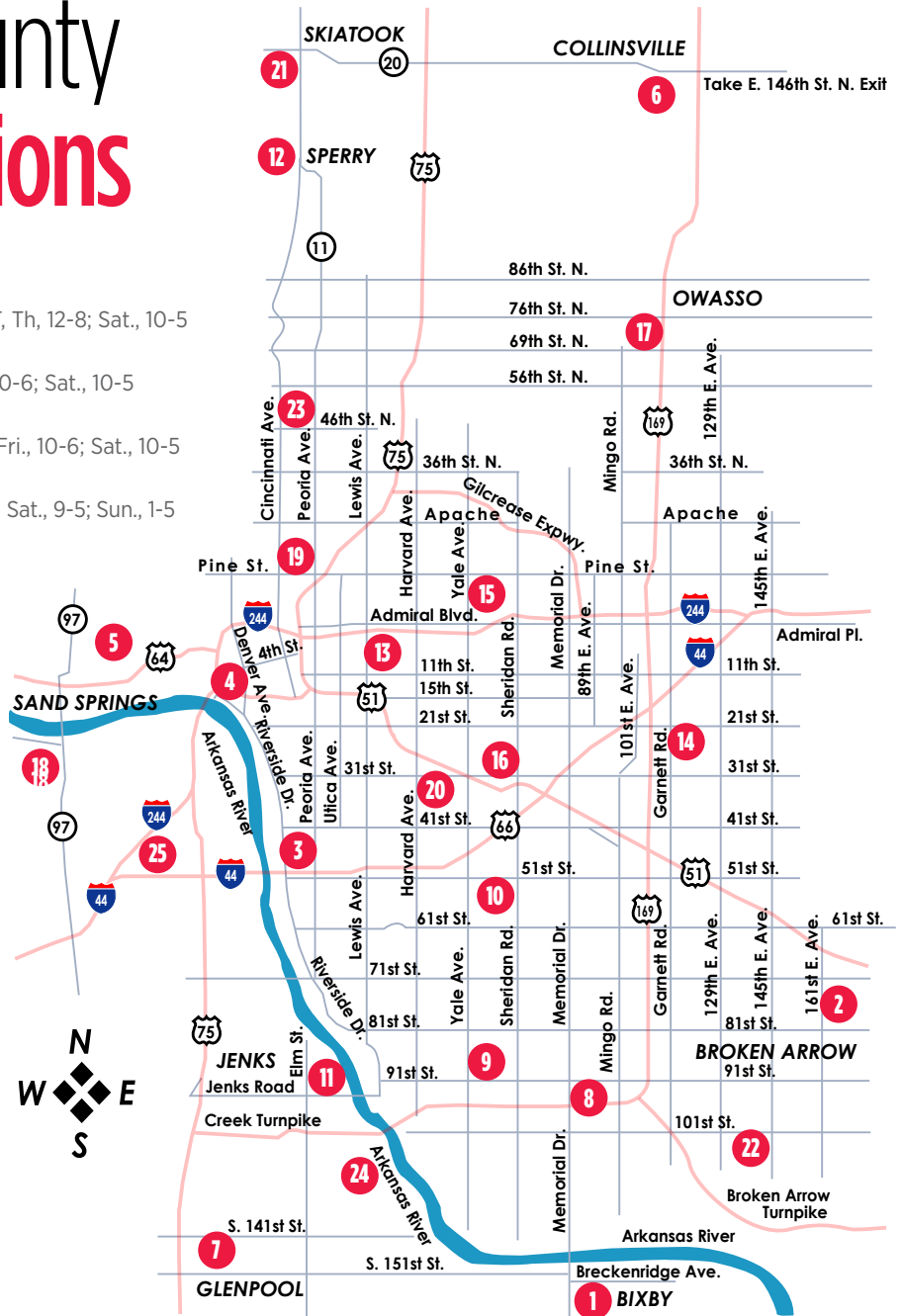
