Create, Play and Learn in the Digital Literacy Lab



From preserving family memories to learning Adobe Photoshop or preparing a design for laser engraving, the Digital Literacy Lab (DLL) at Central Library is a place where curiosity becomes creativity.

Opened in 2016, the American Electric Power/Public Service Company of Oklahoma Foundation Digital Literacy Lab gives Tulsa

City-County Library cardholders access to professional software, specialized equipment and expert guidance.

"The Digital Literacy Lab provides a place for experimentation and learning that can expand to so many different real-world

opportunities," said DLL Coordinator Em Barnard-Cieslewicz. "The ability to play in Canva, Photoshop or Premiere allows folks to work creatively while expanding their skill set and confidence to learn independently in a way that directly translates to work skills and résumé building."

In the DLL, you can edit photos and videos with Adobe Creative Cloud or Apple Creator Studio; code and program with Visual Studio Code, XCode, Godot and Unity Hub; or create digital art and 3D models with Clip Studio Paint, Blender, FreeCAD and Cinema 4D. In addition to creative endeavors, the lab's digitization equipment makes it possible to convert VHS tapes, VHS-C cassettes, MiniDV tapes, 8mm and Super 8 film reels, vinyl records, audiocassettes, photographs and other media into modern digital formats that can be preserved and shared for generations.



For Barnard-Cieslewicz, some of the most memorable moments happen while helping customers reconnect with their own histories. "Our customers use the DLL to make an incredible range of art, film and programs, but I have loved watching folks catalog and preserve their family history," she said. "I had customers discover new family members after working to identify unfamiliar faces, and then they were able to share the high-resolution scans of the photos with those new connections who previously had no access to that history."

Even the digitization process can become part of the experience. "If you have a two-hour home movie, you have to let it run the full two hours to convert it," she said. "This allows folks to sit with these memories again as they convert, which is always a very sweet experience."



Learning in the DLL doesn't stop with individual projects. Throughout the year, the lab offers orientations, workshops and collaborative programs designed to help customers build new skills. September's lineup includes orientations that focus on Adobe Suite and DIY digitization, and a Tech Talk on AI. On the second and fourth Thursdays of each month, local creators can find community through **Drawn Together**, a casual meetup where participants can share works in progress, exchange ideas and inspire one another.

The DLL also works closely with the Maker Space at Central Library, giving customers a seamless path from digital design to physical creation.

"How we work with the Maker Space is something I wish more people knew," Barnard-Cieslewicz said. "We are equipped with the same – and even more – software available in the Maker Space, so if you're looking for a quieter space to prepare your projects and files, come up to the DLL. We also have regular programming where you can learn the software in the DLL before taking your project down to the Maker Space to print, laser engrave and more."

The **Create Your Own Sticker!** event on Saturday, Sept. 19 is the perfect opportunity to see how these spaces coincide. Learn the basics of vector graphics

in the DLL and then use Maker Space equipment to cut the design into a vinyl sticker. Learn more about all DLL and Maker Space events in the Adults & All Ages section of this guide.

Attending an orientation is required before independent use of the lab. Orientations are offered select Tuesdays and Saturdays at 10 a.m., and select Thursdays at 6:30 p.m.

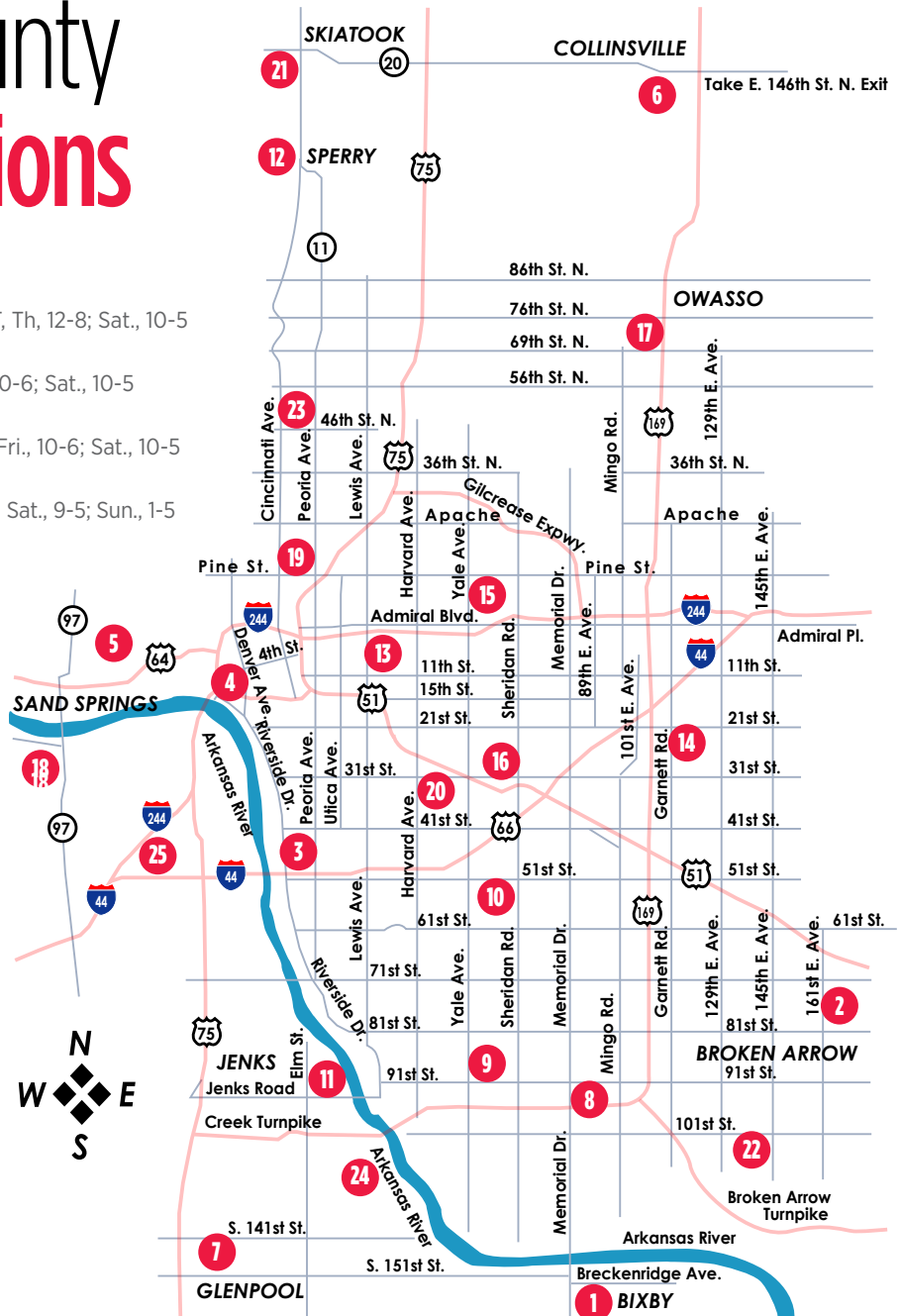
