Yuyi Morales: Una voz de identidad, memoria e inspiración

iOctubre ha llegado y las celebraciones por el mes la herencia hispana en TCCL todavía continúan! Pero esta vez viene lleno de un gran evento, pues

estaremos de manteles largos. Este año el Comité de Selección de Autores del HRC a elegido a Yuyi Morales una de las figuras más importantes de la literatura

infantil contemporánea y una de las voces latinas que ha logrado abrir camino dentro del mundo de la ilustración y la literatura para niños, es por eso por lo que los

invitamos a la celebrar a nuestra honoraria ganadora del **Premio Colibrí en Arte Literaria 2026 (Hummingbird Award in Literary Arts 2026)** Yuyi Morales.

Si tú, como yo tienes pequeñitos en casa, probablemente sabes de quien estoy hablando, pero si no, deja te hablo un poco de nuestra ganadora de este año. Yuyi Morales nació en Xalapa, México. Tras emigrar a los Estados Unidos en 1994, tuvo dificultades con el inglés y la soledad de una cultura que le resultaba ajena, pero encontró consuelo en las bibliotecas públicas, donde leía libros infantiles con su hijo pequeño y redescubrió su interés por las historias y el arte.



Su trayectoria comenzó a destacar a principios de la década del 2000, cuando sus obras empezaron a recibir importantes reconocimientos. En 2004 *Harvesting Hope: The story of César Chávez* y *Just a Minute: A Trickster Tale and a Counting Book* recibieron reconocimientos que marcaron un momento decisivo en su carrera. En *Just a Minute*, además de convertirse en una de sus obras más queridas, recibió la Medalla Pura Belpré, un reconocimiento que celebra la excelencia de autores e ilustradores latinos cuya obra representa y celebra la experiencia cultural latina. Este

libro es uno de mis favoritos, porque nos lleva de la mano a través de una celebración muy especial: el día de los muertos, si soy honesta, de todas las celebraciones que existen durante el año iesta es mi favorita! Ni siquiera mi cumpleaños me gusta tanto como el día de los muertos. Este libro me transporta a mi infancia en México y me hace recordar todas las historias que mi mamá me contaba sobre mi abuelo. El personaje de la abuela Beetle me recuerda mucho a él; siempre listo para las celebraciones y, sobre todo, siempre buscando la manera de hacer felices a chicos y grandes.

Estos primeros premios fueron el comienzo de una trayectoria extraordinaria que llevaría a Morales a convertirse en una de las autoras e ilustradoras latinas más reconocidas de la literatura infantil. Años más tarde, su trabajo alcanzaría otro momento histórico cuando se convirtió en la primera ilustradora latina en recibir la Medalla Caldecott de Honor, uno de los reconocimientos más prestigiosos de la literatura infantil en Estados Unidos, por *Viva Frida*. Estos reconocimientos no solo hablan de su talento



artístico, sino también de la importancia de contar historias que durante mucho tiempo tuvieron poca representación dentro de la literatura infantil.

En *Dreamers*, titulado en español como *Soñadores*, es una historia profundamente personal inspirada en su propia experiencia como inmigrante. En este libro, la autora habla de la resiliencia, el sentido de pertenencia y el descubrimiento de nuevos caminos a través de un lugar que puede convertirse en refugio: la biblioteca. *Dreamers* es también una celebración de las posibilidades que ofrece la lectura y del poder que tienen los libros para ayudarnos a encontrar una voz, una identidad y un lugar al que podamos llamar hogar.



Otro de mis favoritos es *Bright Star*, publicado en español como *Lucero*. Este impresionante libro está lleno de belleza y sensibilidad, y sus ilustraciones nos transportan al desierto de Sonora. Al observar los nopales en sus páginas, no pude evitar recordar aquella vez en México cuando, por querer arrancar la flor de una nopalera, terminé espinándome. Pero bueno, esa es otra historia. Lo que sí puedo decir es que este libro despertó en mí una conexión muy personal con ese paisaje y con los recuerdos de mi infancia.

En *Lucero*, Yuyi Morales utiliza la imagen de una cierva que avanza por un paisaje hermoso, pero también peligroso, para construir una historia sobre el valor de seguir adelante. Una voz suave la acompaña y la anima a continuar, enfrentar sus miedos y superar los obstáculos que aparecen en su camino. La historia transmite un mensaje sencillo, pero poderoso: aunque el camino pueda ser difícil y desconocido, siempre hay una luz que nos puede guiar.

Quizás eso sea precisamente lo que más admiro de las obras de Yuyi Morales. Sus historias parten de experiencias profundamente personales como, la familia, la migración, la cultura, los recuerdos y las raíces, pero logran convertirse en mensajes universales. A través de sus palabras e ilustraciones, Morales nos recuerda que nuestras historias tienen valor, que nuestras raíces forman parte de quienes somos y que, aun frente a los cambios y las dificultades, siempre podemos encontrar motivos para seguir adelante con esperanza.

Este sábado 31 de octubre de 10:30 a.m. a 12 p.m. en la biblioteca Regional Martin rendiremos homenaje a **Yuyi Morales**, prestigiosa autora e ilustradora de libros infantiles, quien ofrecerá una charla sobre su vida y trayectoria artística. Además, tendremos la oportunidad de disfrutar de una firma de libros.

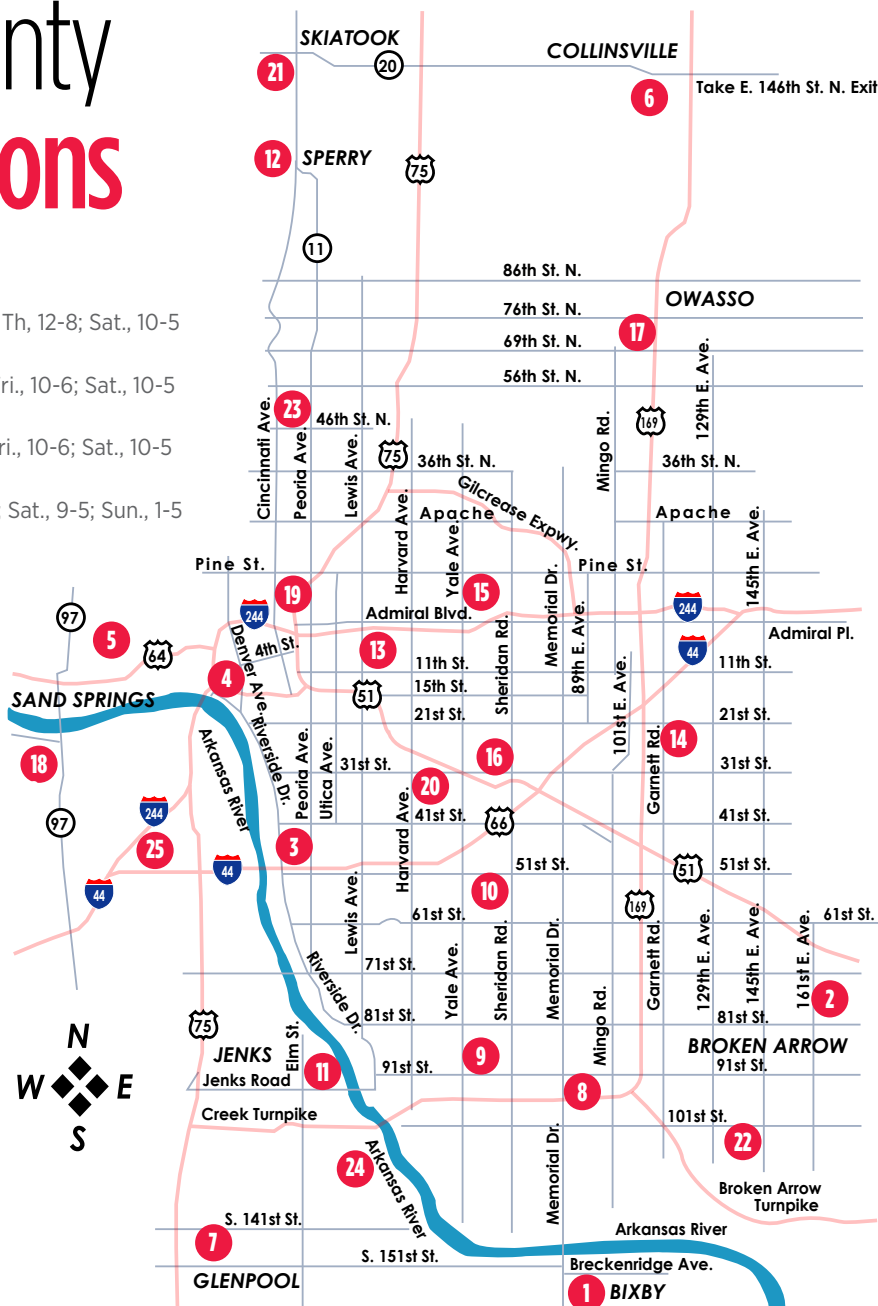
